- <u>Garden Partners</u> by Diane Palmisciano, Atheneum Gram and granddaughter plant and harvest a garden. Charming pictures.
- 3. <u>Happy Birthday. Grampie</u> by Susan Pearson, Dial Martha goes to visit her blind, Swedish grandpa in the nursing home on his birthday; lovely, soft illustrations.
- 4. <u>When Grandma Came</u> by Jill Walsh and Sophy Williams, Viking Grandma has been many places and seen many things but nothing compares to her granddaughter. repetition of text; wonderfully descriptive prose.
- 5. <u>Tulips</u> by Jay O'Callahan and Debrah Santini, Picture Book Studio Pierre loved to play tricks on everyone. He visits his grandmother at her estate outside of Paris. His tulip joke backfires. Delightful story!
- 6. <u>Grandma's House</u> by E. Moore, Lothrop The gentle, unconditional love that his grandma has for her granddaughter is inspiring.
- 7. <u>I Go With My Family to Grandma's</u> by Riki Levinson, E.P. Dutton. Somewhat like the jumprope rhyme, the pattern to this story is fun and easy.

 A little boy tells his granddaddy all the things he'll do when he gets
 old. the illustrations show that he is doing those things now.

- 10. <u>That Sky, That Rain by</u> Carolyn Orto; Thomas Crowell Limited text describes the brief conversation Grandpa and grandson have in the barn yard before a storm.
- 11. <u>The Doorbell Rang</u> by Pat Hutchins, Greenwillow Books Simple story that proves that no one makes cookies like Grandma!
- 12. <u>Grandpa's Face</u> by Eloise Greenfield, Philomel Books A grandfather explains his unconditional love for his granddaughter.
- 13. <u>The Grandpa Days</u> by Joan W. Blos, Simon and Schuster, 1989. Grandpa helps young Phillip build a sled.
- <u>Visitors for Edward</u> by Michael Morgan, E.P. Dutton, 1987. Edward overhears his parents discussing a surprise visitor for the morning. He imagines all sorts of things.
- 15. <u>Grandpa's Song</u> by Tony Johnston, Dial Books, 1991. The bighearted warmth of a grandfather and his family is innovatively illustrated in this story about a lovable, singing Grandpa.
- 16. <u>Grandma's Secret</u> by Paulette Bourgeois, Little Brown and Co., 1989. Grandma likes to watch trains go by, marshmellow cookies and rocking on the porch. She has a bear in the basement, supposedly, and scares her grandson until he investigates on his own.

 Darcy has a very understanding grandma who helps her adjust to a new baby in the family.
