






We See ...

MAIN FLOOR



IDA K. MARTIN AWARDS

All seniors except the Lincoln essay winners are eligible for the Martin awards. Mrs. Ida K. Martin, in February, 1920, when she was national president of the Women's Relief Corps, gave \$1,000 to the Decatur Board of Education. The interest from this money supplies two

prizes, one for a boy and one for a girl. Those entering are graded upon the content and style of their essays, delivery, and citizenship. The essays may not exceed one thousand words and may be on any phase of patriotism.

MARY W. FRENCH AWARDS

This year Porter Womeldorff, first place, and Janet Mueller, second place, were honored with the Mary W. French awards. The French honors are chosen by the Faculty Cabinet. Miss French, for forty years a member of the Decatur High School faculty, presented \$1,000 to the school to make possible these awards.

She stipulated that those honored must have achieved more than high scholastic standing. They must have served the school in some outstanding manner, have been good and loyal citizens of the school, and have been active in school organizations.

C.

LINCOLN ESSAY AWARD

Mrs. Inez J. Bender, formerly a member of the Decatur School Board and one of the foremost civic leaders in Decatur's history, gave a sum of money to the school board before her death to establish a Lincoln Essay Contest in memory of her father, who was a great admirer of Lincoln. This money is divided equally between the boy and the girl from each year's June Senior Class, who write winning essays on Lincoln. These awards are presented to them at the June Commencement exercises.

The contestants are judged fifty per cent on the essay itself, twenty-five per cent on their ability to read it before the judges, and twentyfive per cent on their school citizenship.
