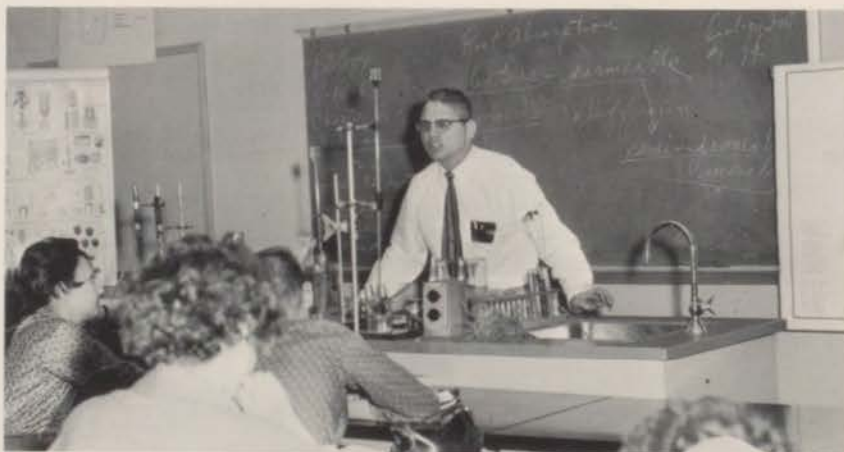


SCIENCE

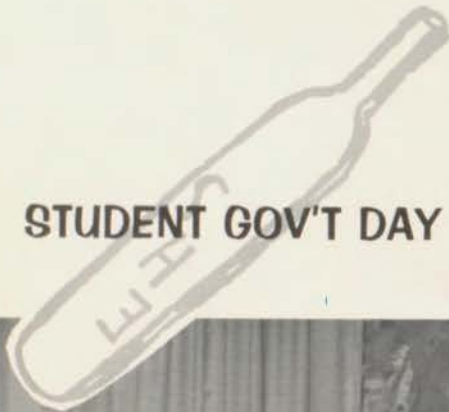
NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY INDUCTION

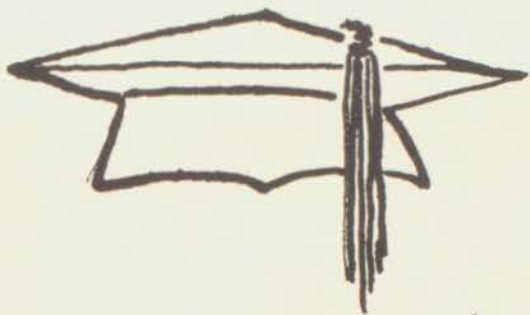
