

3. Brad Cantrell's description of this house's architecture follows:

1458 W. Macon, built in 1923, has many features of the Federal Style which is sometimes referred to as Colonial. It was a revival of a style quite popular in the mid-1800's in Illinois. This two-story structure employs all of the major elements of the style such as: broken pediments over the entrance, and dormers, symmetrical facade with few projections, arrangement of windows, slight roof overhang, brick construction, gabled roof and ornamental window shutters.
