## LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS OF DECATUR

#### Decetur, Illinois

July 8, 1968

The meeting was held in the home of Mrs. Robert Mee, 279 Victoria Ct., with Mrs. Keith Westenhaver presiding.

PRESENT: Mesdames Westenhauer, Barber, Schade, Crow, Hippler, Johnson, Protzman, Tilley, Weinman, Butler, Miller, Dunas, Beck, Mee and

Homan .

ABSENT: Mesdames Heilman and Landholt.

MINUTES: Approved as corrected. Mrs. Mee was present and there were no absentees. On Page 4 under VOTERS SERVICE, Mrs. Protzman moved that Mrs. Homan pick the place (for the Candidates Meeting) she felt most suitable to our needs. Seconded and passed. Under PUBLICITY, Mrs. seinman distributed the NATIONAL C.T.LOGUES, instead of Board Reports.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Cash on hand 5-21-68, \$256.88. Receipts, \$298.50. Expenditures, \$298.85. Cash on hand 7-8-68 \$149.99. Mrs. Johnson announced that she had ordered latterheads and they are in at Allied Printing. She asked that anyone who needs envelopes and stationary should get them from her.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: 1) A Mrs. Maynor from the Christian Science Shurch offered us convention supplements to the Christian Science Monitor. They are free and written from a non-partisan standpoint. Mrs. Westenhaver has asked her for 50 copies. (The supplements contain information on candidates, conventions and delegates.) 2) There was a president's mailing on Jun legislation from the new National President, Mrs. Benson. 3) The State Board Member assigned to our League is Mrs. Samuel Rome. She wants all monthly bulletins and other mailings. 4) The policy for Times for Action is as follows: Two or three carbons of letters should be made for local, State and sometimes National Chairmen. Replies go into the appropriate chairman's file. If we do not respond to a Time for Action, we should let the appropriate board, State or National, know why.

PhoGraM: Committee chairmen gave the following reports:

Mrs. Back of Human Resources presented a proposed letter to Mayor Rupp and the Decatur City Council concerning our stand on the Human Relations Commission. The Board recommended that Mrs. Lestenhaver have a list of specific cities having ordinances similar to the one League is proposing in case she is questioned when she presents the lett to the City Council.

Mrs. Beck also presented a letter of protest to the Editor of the Herald and deview in case the Council passes an ordinance containing nothing more than advisory powers. Mrs. Tilley sugge sted we change the wording of the letter and send it before the Council acts. The feeling of the Board was that we follow Mrs. Tilley's suggestion.

VOIERS SERVICE Are. Homen read a letter of thanks from County Clerk Tengney for our demonstrations of the Voting Devices. We received 4 phone calls for information on voting in response to Public Service announcements on assistant TV.

In a discussion of the Candidates Meeting, it was decided to give the candidates for State Office 5 minutes apiece and the candidates for County office 3 minutes.

Mr. Westbrook of WDZ Radio was first choice for moderator. Questions for candidates should be ready for approval at the next Board Meeting.

The Post Office has offered to make space available for non-partisan voter's service from Sept. 7 to Oct. 7. Mr. Tangney would like us to help the last two weekends before the election. Since Mrs. doman is so busy with the candidates Meeting, it was suggested we find someone else to be in charge of the rost Office Display.

FINANCE The Board discussed whether it should authorize Ars. Mee to write a letter of Protest to the National Gnairman of the Finance Drive (with copies to State) in regard to the request for a drive in Galendar "68 to coincide with the National drive. Mrs. Mee moved we do not have a Finance Drive in calendar "68 - but go ahead with our original plans for an early March "69 drive. Seconded and Passed.

MEMBERSHIP Mrs. Schade, Organization Vice President discussed the Summer Coffee for prespective or new members. It was decided to have the coffee in the fell due to vecetions and other League committments. It will be held early in September at 1 PM in a public place. A film on Mater Resources will be shown. Mrs. Dumas, Membership chairman, asked if anyone had husbands in vivic organizations, notary, etc. who might have wives interested in joining League.

Voltak Mrs. dutler announced that the VOTER Deadline will be August 22. following is her final report on the "THIS IS MACON COUNTY" book:

REPORT TO THE DECATUR LAW BOARD OF DIRECTORS JULY 8, 1968

THOUGHTS AND SUGGESTIONS BY K. BUTLER ON THE FUTURE DISTRIBUTION OF "THIS IS MACON GO."

(1) when the editorial staff is appointed for a new or revised Macon Co. bodea chairman for sales & distribution should also be appointed. The purpose of this
book should be clearly defined and worked out by them and their committee.

Due to the amount of money involved and the problems incurred this year in getting
these books to the public; I feel that the Board members themselves may have to
take a more active part in sales.

what people will benefit from the book? Who will buy it? How many do you hope to sell? Who should receive free copies? How many copies will be given free?

(2) Do you intend to make a profit? Do you intend to meet expenses? If printing costs are as high as this year's, are you again prepared to take a loss? The price of the handbook is important. Was the 75 cents this year too high? Maybe a token price (25 cents?) should be set. Maybe they should all be given free? Maybe this should be a community service with the distribution clearly established fairly by the League. All segments of the community and our county were not reached. More emphasis should be placed on reaching outlying communities and minority group organizations.

- (3) No percental school purchased any books this year. The Decetur public school district bought 600 copies at a discount price totaling \$390.00. The Board (LaV) then decided to waive this charge due to the failure of the referendum. This was made very clear in a letter to the school district and should in no way affect the next book. (dopefully!) -- Inouldn't all schools have this book! Again I emphasize who would benefit from these books? How many can we hope to sell just to individuals? Large orders are very few, can we depend on them?
- (4) Men and Women's service clubs were not interested (Except AAUN & Assoc. Of Comm.)
- (5) Major Decatur industry was contacted. July three responded, only two purchaseds
- (6) Books were placed at banks, Tengney's office, real estate offices, drug stores, and beauty salons. The last two made the most sales.
- (7) Haines and Essicks were very nice, however, I was told that they probably would ask for a commission on each book sold next time. (Historical Society booklet sold for \$1.30, ikkt's received 25 cents.)
- (8) In the past our Macon Co. book has been excellent. Hany people have worked very hard to produce it. It is something to be proud of, something that cost a great deal of time and woney. It includes information that the League wants the public to be aware of. In the future, a distribution plan must be presented to the Board at the same lime the editorial staff presents its plans this will give the Board a clearer picture of the problems involved and should help in making the decision whether to print a new book.

PUBLIC ALLATIONS Mrs. parber, Public Relations Vice President, read a letter from the Chamber of Cornercs written by Steve Bellenger asking what we could do in the Clean-up campaign for poor people. They need trucks and leaders to direct young people involved in the clean-up. They did not need organizational and clerical help. It was decided that League as an organization could not give the kind of service need/d. However, individual League members will be encouraged to co-operate.

PUBLICATIONS Mrs. Jeinman mentioned the Special State Subscription Service to News Media, etc. Jrs. Jeinman moved that she ask the Library Board if they would like for us to pe for their subscription. Seconded and passed. She will send letters to the Naws Media informing them of the availability of this service.
