

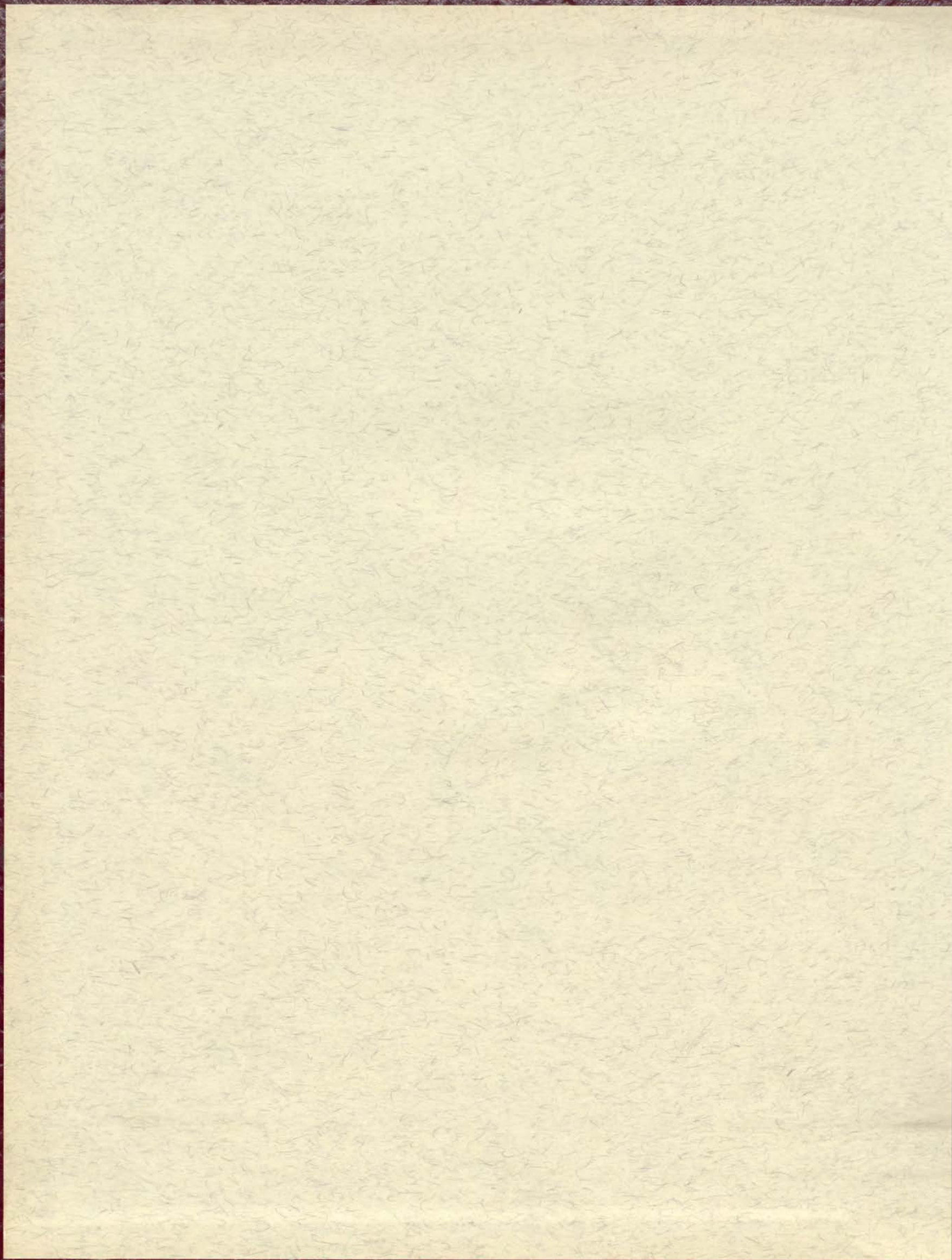

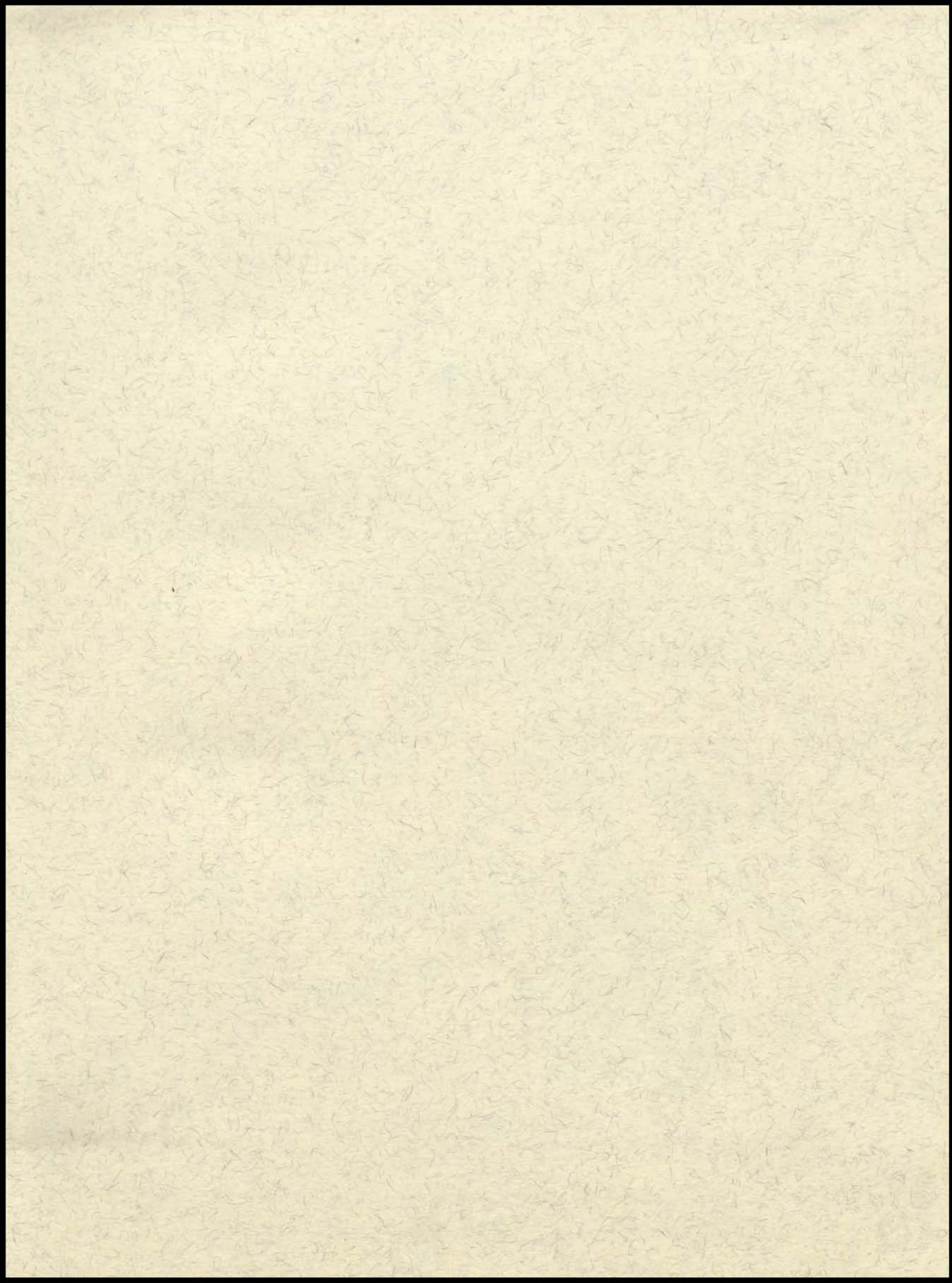

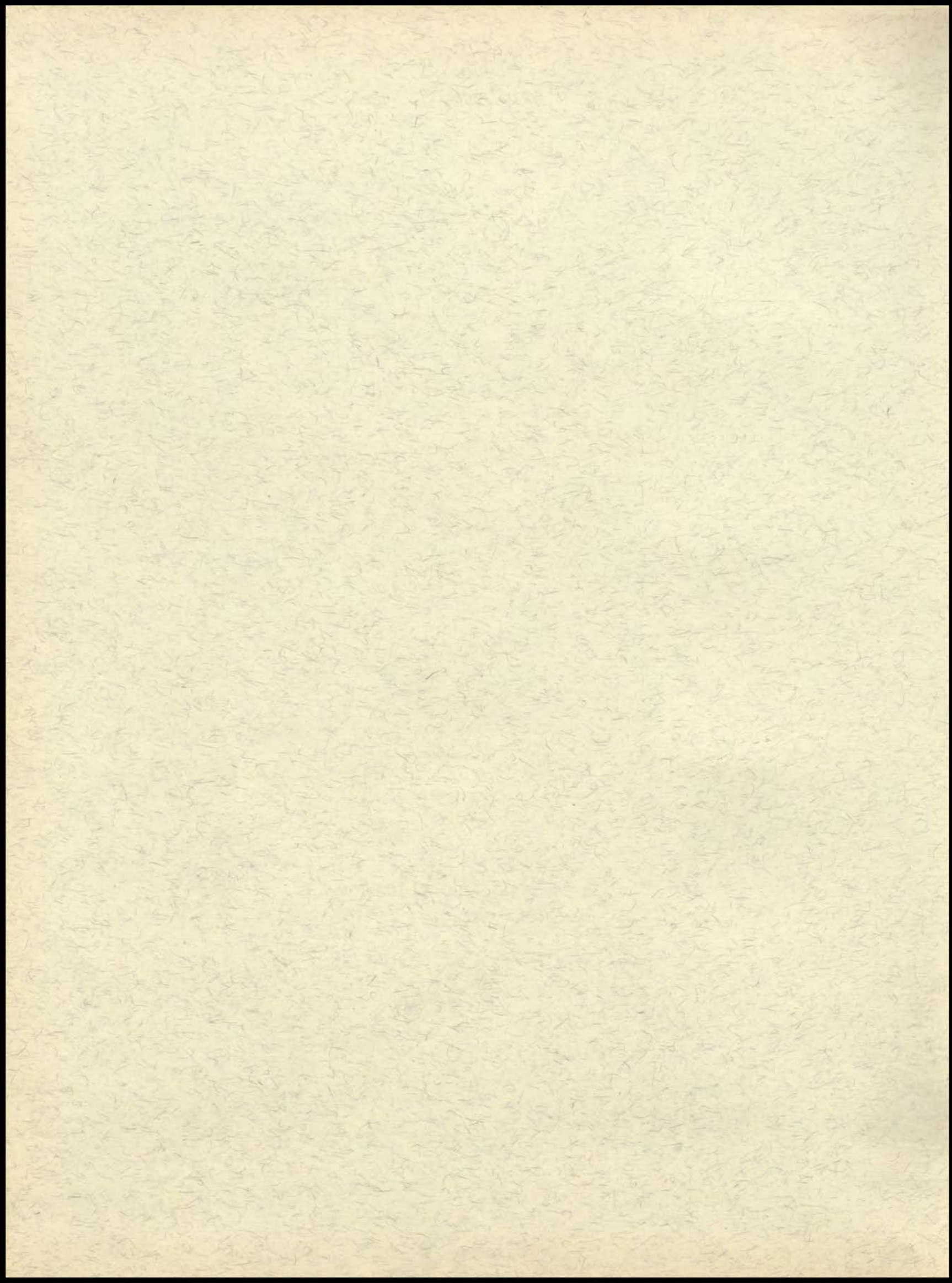

Spice is added to life through friendship. Our classmates provide the main source of this ingredient. Without friends one's life would have little purpose.

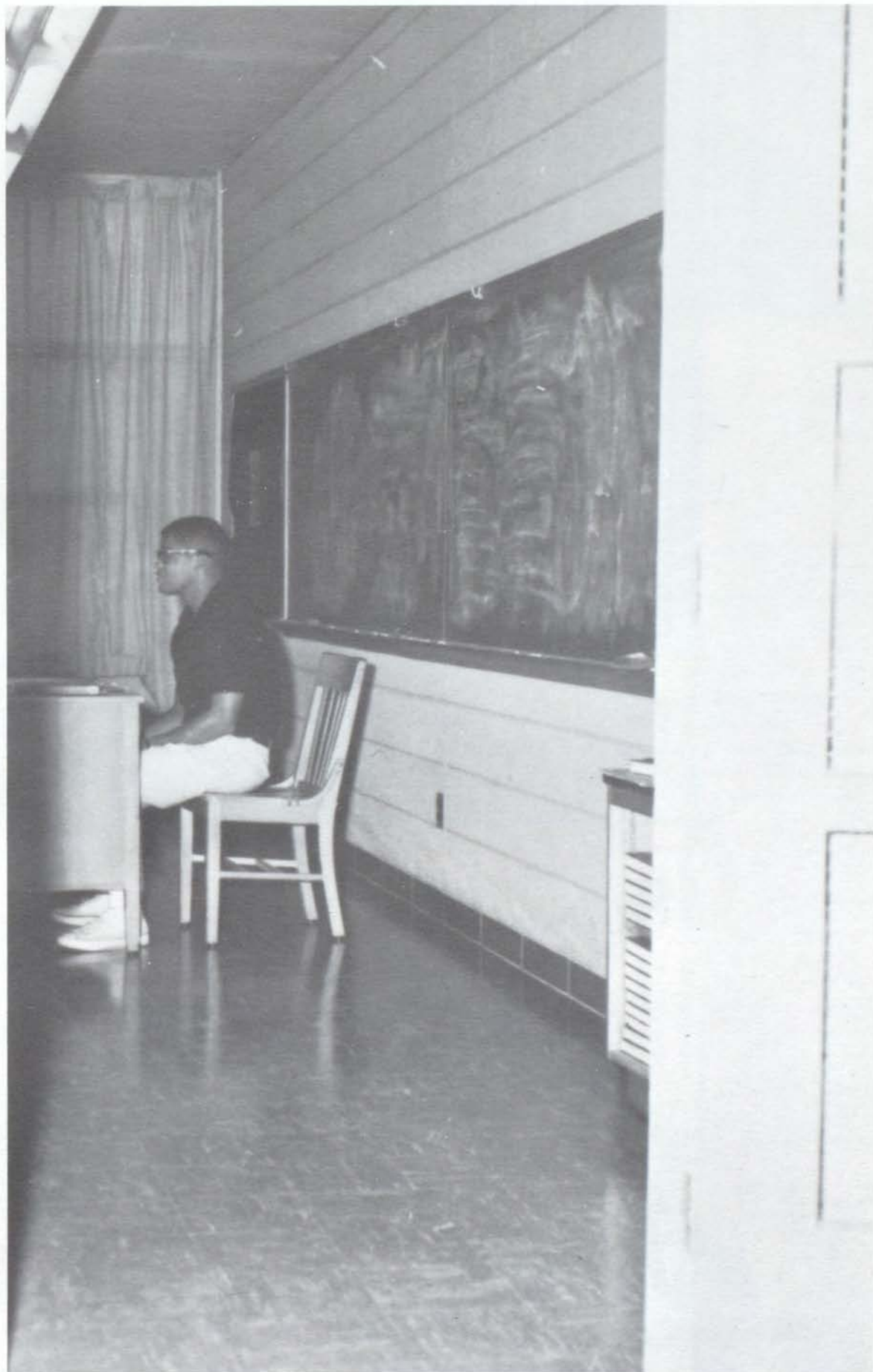
Though high school begins to shape one's life, by adding knowledge, experience, and friends, it cannot possibly complete the task. Graduation is not the end, but "Just a Beginning."

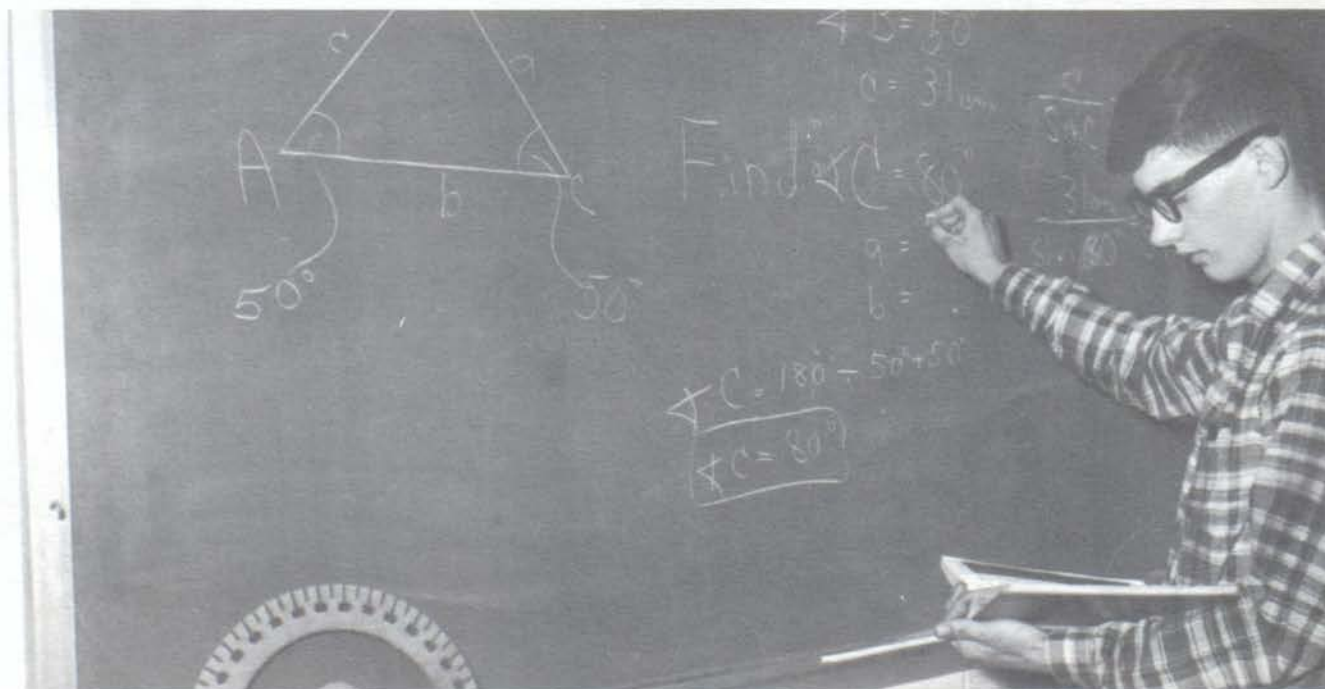
Math

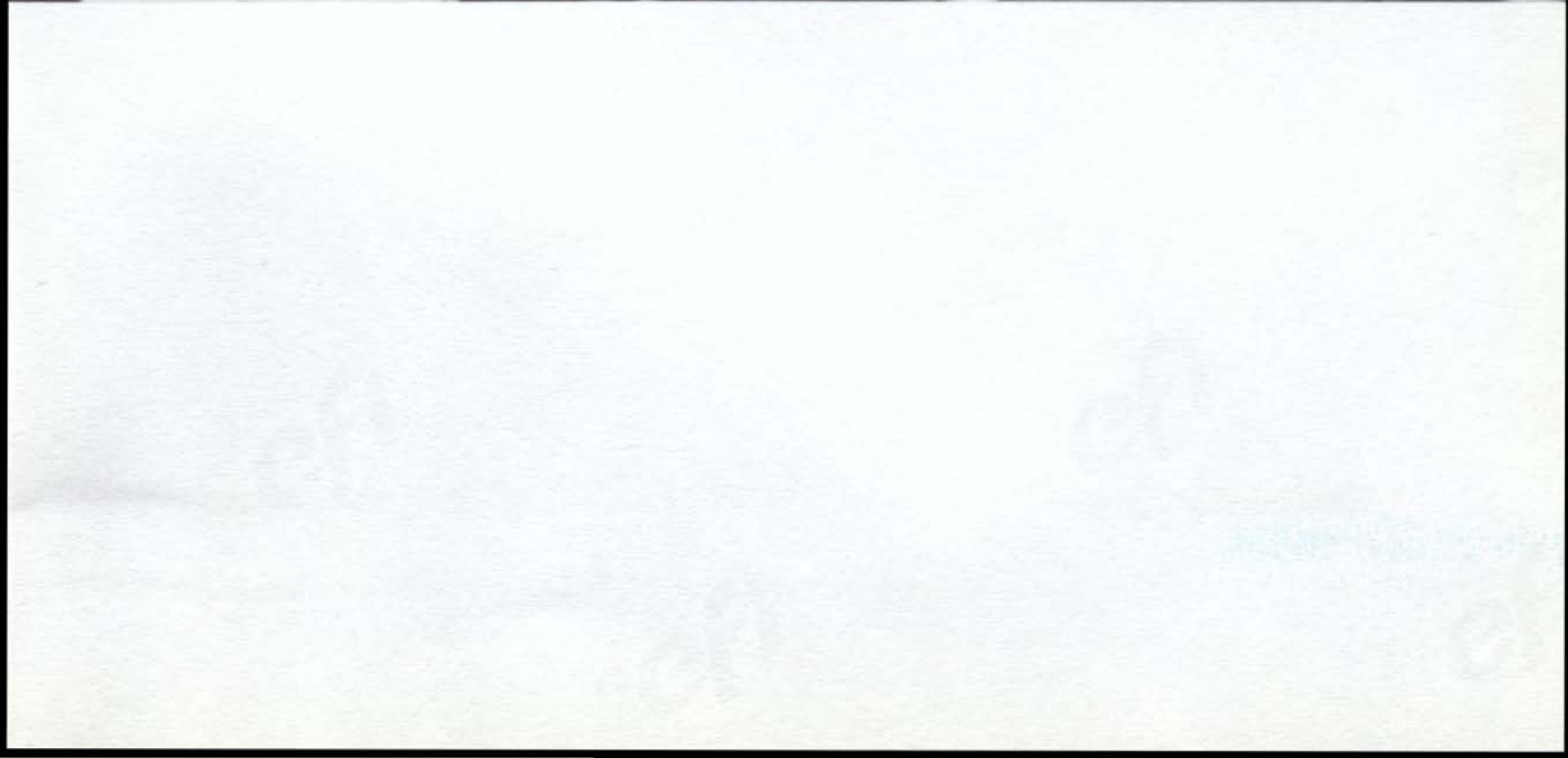

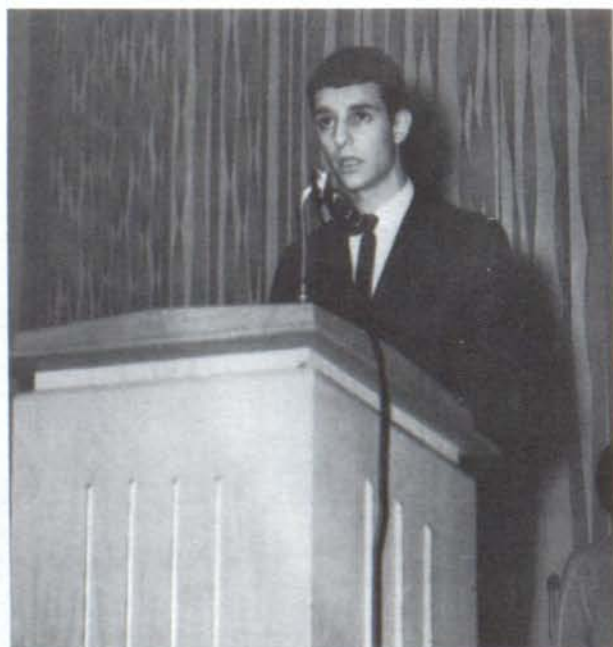
The Presidential candidates plan their speeches.

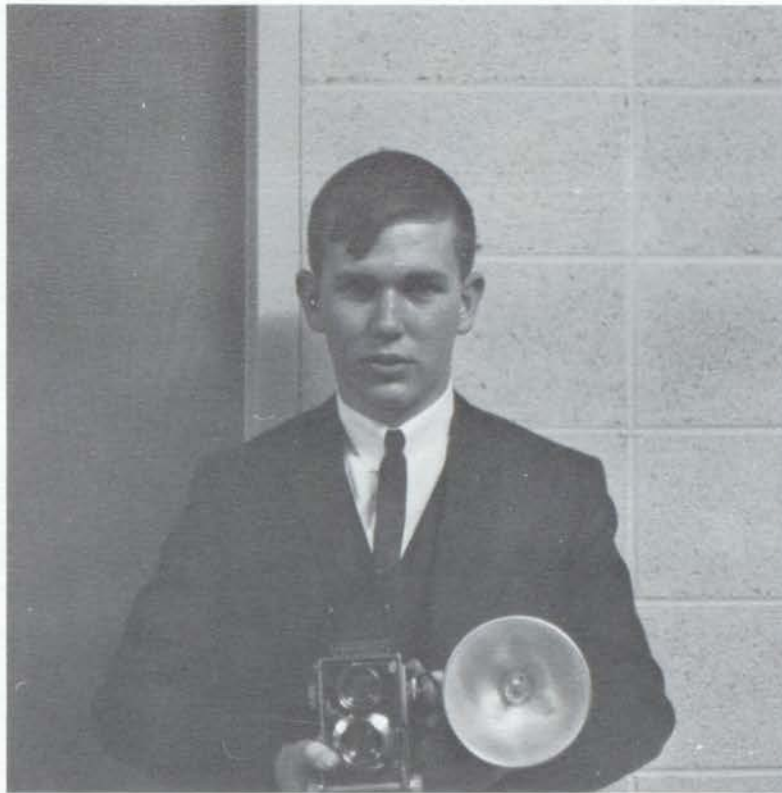

An explosive opening game victory over Jacksonville, the Black & White's first in six years with the Crimson, provided the springboard for the finest record in Eisenhower's nine year history. The panthers roared through eight opponents, losing only to a fine Stephen Decatur team, 14-6. Averaging almost four touchdowns per game to one for opponents, Eisenhower set season and single game scoring highs and captured the Capitol Conference Championship. Quincy and Matton fell for the first time and the Panther win over MacArthur in the Annual Veterans' Day game gave Eisenhower a winning edge over all of its city rivals.

Highlights of the season included the blitz of Jacksonville, the goal line stand and subsequent 98 yard scoring drive that broke Griffen, Jenkin's 70 yard punt return against Quincy, his three touchdowns in the comeback win against Lamphier for the championship, and the passing of Tuley against MacArthur.

It was the year of the "Barnes Special"—the bomb—an end-around play that saw Mahlon Sanders throwing deep to Jenkins, a play that ignited many a scoring drive, and typified the explosiveness of a Panther attack that must go down as the most versatile ever. The blocking of Wilder, the line play of Cox, McAdamis, Corey, Derlitzki, and Hensen, the pass-receiving of Buttz, Sanders, and Williams, the running of Jenkins and Jelks, and the passing of Tuley all combined to make the Panthers definitely "go-go". Defensive specialists Firtney, Smith, Schultz, Euler, and Wiand, along with Derlitzke, the team's leading tackler, helped the offense to control most of the games.

Jenkins was elected Most Valuable Player and became the school's fourth All-State Player. Derlitzki won the Panther Trophy and Dave Corey received the Optimist Club Award.
