

## 3. Architectural description as written by Bradford Cantrell, early 1976:

The home at 627 South Crea was built in 1920. It has several Prairie School characteristics which can be seen in its wide over-hanging eaves, strip casement windows placed directly under the eaves and large blank spaces. The sharp contrast of colors are additional Prairie influences which can be seen in the use of several materials such as plaster and wood in timbering and trim, stone in the corner piers, and brick incorporated in the first floor.
