

WILLIAM HENRY HIBBS.

William Henry Hibbs of rural route 1, died at 2:15 o'clock Wednesday morning at the Decatur and Macon County hospital. He was seventy-five years old last August. His death was caused by paralysis. He had been in poor health since his first stroke two years ago. The second stroke came Tuesday morning and he was taken to the hospital that afternoon.

Mr. Hibbs was born in Petersburg, Ill., Aug. 16, 1852. He had made his home in and around Decatur for the last twenty years. He was a carpenter by trade, but retired about three years ago. He was a member of the First Methodist church. He is survived by two children, John F. Hibbs and Henry P. Hibbs, both of Decatur. He also leaves his brothers and sisters: Henry Hibbs and Mrs. Amanda Jones of Petersburg, Mrs. Lou Hurd of Athens, Miss Nellie Hibbs of Rock Port, Ind., and a half-brother, John England, in Iowa. The body was taken to Moran & Sons, funeral directors, and prepared for burial.
