AMMOUNCELENTS: 1) League members aere being urged to help man the office of the Citizens Cornittee for A New Constitution which is opening next week. Gene Brown, chairman of the Citizens Committee has also requested Leggue help on a radio talk show to be on Nomember 23. 2) The new Mational Board Report was given to all National program chairmen. 3) League Action Service which includes copies of Time for Action and Report from the Hill, will be subscribed to for the U.S Congress Committee: 4) A report on the state of current national legislation of interest to League was passed around. 5) A letter from the Champaign League president was read aloud. It concerned their interview with Representative Springer about the trade bill restricting imports. 6) A letter and materials was received from Hr. Springer concerning the environmental protection agency bill. 7) State Pep Corps trip to Washington will be Harch 23. Cost - \$150.
