


This book has a searching purpose: to illustrate a true glimpse into the 1957-58 school year.


The nucleus of Journalism II work is the production of this yearbook, just as the Journalism I course edits the newspaper, "The Echo."

Expansion and school management are capably handled by the administration.


Lakeview has been in existence for nine years and forms an independent community school district adjoining Decatur. An evaluation of \$20,000,000 supports approximately 800 students in this Junior-Senior High School plus pupils in four grade schools.

During the school year, the educational rate was raised from \$1.65 to \$2 and a bond issue to build a new grade school (Brush College No. 2) was passed by referendum.




LAKEVIEW VARSITY FOOTBALL
