

Large Crowds Enjoy Homestead's Event about True Story from Decatur's History

Local author Mary Lynn Potter's book, "The Forgotten Life of Sarah Grady," has captured the hearts and imaginations of Decaturarea residents. Three presentations at the James Millikin Homestead were able to bring to life a portion of Sarah Grady's life for an appreciative audience. Lucien and Brigitta Kapp set the stage, describing life at the Homestead during the early 1900s, complete with anecdotes about the nearby residents of Millikin Place including Sarah's husband, William "Bill" Grady. Nurse Pearl Waddell (aka Board Member Linda Ostrander) told the story of the Homestead's vital role in the 1918 Flu Pandemic. Mary Lynn shared readings from her book and welcomed Sarah Grady (aka Board Member Julie Carter) to discuss her memories of that time. All three presentations included refreshments and tours of the Homestead and were well attended as the visitors were entertained and informed about an interesting period of Decatur and Millikin Homestead history.

Sarah's story will continue as the Homestead plans to host

In her obituary she was aptly described as "a vigorous and determined woman who did not like to be idle and discouraged idleness in those around her."

Ann swam daily in the early morning at Decatur Health Club, part of her disciplined routine which no doubt helped keep her young and active to the very end.
