

PROPOSED LOCAL PROGRAM FOR 1975-76

County and Township Governments

Support for elimination of townships in Macon County with their functions transferred to general purpose governments, such as the county or municipalities.

Support for Home Rule status for the county with establishment of an elected county executive. (If necessary we would support appointment of an administrator by the County Board until an executive can be elected.)

Support for elimination as elective offices those at the county level which do not set policy, such as Auditor, Recorder of Deeds, and Coroner.

Decatur's Environmental Quality

Support for adequate storm and sanitary sewers,

* Study of proposed storm sewer drainage program for Decatur. (The board authorized an emergency study at the Feb. Board Meeting.)

Council-Manager Form of City Government
Support for Council-Manager form of city government.

Decatur Public Schools

Support of the middle school grade organization (5-3-4, 4-4-4) and concept as best meeting our educational goals.

Support of increased funds to provide quality education and adequate

Emphasis on local community responsibility to require the school system to develop each child's potential.

You will note that an emergency mini-study on storm sewers is being done. Pat McVay and Carol Campbell are League representatives to the Citizens Advisory Committee for Improved Storm Drainage. They will be giving a report on March 19 (See calendar).

Proposed Local Program 1975-76, cont.

Human Resources and Civil Rights

Support for provisions for enforcement of the Fair Housing Ordinance in Decatur.

Support for funds for the Decatur Human Relations Commission.

No new local studies are recommended, other than the emergency storm sewer drainage study.

The board received two suggestions for possible study - or action:

Decatur Public Schools: If declining school enrollment should bring about a need to change attendance centers, we should be prepared to state, perhaps re-define, our positions. The board did not recommend a study.

Child Abuse: Our state Child Welfare program item includes positions on development of child abuse legislation and mandatory reporting of physical abuse of children. The board felt that we could join with other community groups in educating the public on this problem without a local study.

PROPOSED BY LAW CHANGES

ARTICLE VII. MEETINGS

Section 2. Annual Meeting. An Annual Meeting shall be held in March, the exact date to be determined by the Board of Directors.

Suggested change: An Annual Meeting shall be held in April......

Section 4. Quorum. Twenty-two members shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of the League of Women Voters of Decatur, Illinois. Suggested change: Twenty percent (20%) of the total membersbip.....

If the proposed change in Article V.I., Meetings, is adopted, the following changes will be necessary in:

ARTICLE V. OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS.

Section 1. Officers. They shall take office the first day of April.

Section 2. Elected Directors. They shall take office the first day of April.

Section 3. Appointed Directors. The term of office of the Appointed Directors shall be one year and shall expire the first day of April.

Suggested change:the first day of May.
