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INTRODUCTORY

In presenting to the public the Seventeenth Volume of the Decatur City Directory, the publishers and compiler enjoy the consciousness of having done their work well and thoroughly. This is the fourteenth issue of the Ebel City Directory and the fourth under the present management.

Seventeen thousand one hundred and thirty three names will be found in this issue of the Directory, which, if multiplied by only two, would show a population for the city and suburbs of 34,266. Other Directory publishers use from 2 1/2 to 3 1/2 to a name. This is accounted for in the larger cities for the reason that only heads of families are taken, or males over 21, while here we take all over 18 years of age (except the wives). We estimate the population at 34,000, being an increase of 1,000 for the past year.

Decatur is growing rapidly, and a comparison with the number of names in the Directory ten and twenty years ago shows how rapidly we are growing. In 1886 the Directory contained 6,499 names, in 1896, 12,213, in 1906 (this issue), 17,133. The gain the past five years has been the greatest, 4,150 names, or 1,000 more than from the years 1896 to 1901, showing a gain in population of over 8,000. The growth and prosperity of Decatur is sure to continue. The new \$150,000 Wabash shops mean much for the future of our city, as do also the new Starch Works, the doubling of the capacity of the Faries Manufacturing Co., the new Decatur Fountain Co., and the enlarging of other plants; also the extended interurban lines. A large number of business blocks and residences have been built the past season and plans made for a large number next year.

The wonderful growth of Decatur has fully demonstrated the necessity of a yearly Directory. More than one-half the addresses in our 1905 issue have been changed.

For the liberal advertising patronage and hearty co-operation accorded us, we desire to express our thanks, and hope we will ever be able to merit its continuance.
