Some of the filedon o Miss Lottie Cook whose father managed the Innes farms, stated on July 13th, 1975 that the Packards lived at 401 N. College when the Innes family lived just south of it on College Hill. L. L. Baldridge was the contractor employed by C. E. England to reconstruct the house in 1916. Mr. Baldridge almost lost everything, for World War I had begun, costs had risen, and Mr. England held him to the original contract.
