BOARD HERTING

May 20, 1970

Heeting was held at the home of Mrs. Harvin Lauterjung, 208 Brownlow Drive, with President, Mrs. Robert Schade presiding.

PRESENT: Mesdames Schade, Beck, Meyerson, Coberly, Butler, Dakin, Ohlsen, Mughes, Meinman, Panetti, Mippler, Lauterjung, Mardy, and Grieve.

ABSENT: Hesdame Dumas.

MINUTES: Approved as corrected. Correction was made to read that Mrs. Clifford Smith rather than Mrs. Clifford is chairman of the nominating committee.

TREASURERS REPORT: Cash on hand 4-22-70 \$353.38

ANNOUNCE HENTS: 1) Reservations are due May 22 for the State Regional to be held in Springfield on May 26. Several board embers expressed a desire to attend. 2) Delegates from Illinois Leagues will meet on September 1 to discuss what action will be taken on the proposed constitution, whether we will support all or part of it or do only voters service. The meeting will be held in Arlington Heights, Illinois. 3) Mrs. Schade has received a tentative State 2 Mational schedule for next year. 4) There will be Times for Action on the executive, revenue and judicial articles when the tile is right. 5) A film on Con Con is available for use by local Leagues. 6) Another request for no inations for state officers was received from State. 7) National Convention: A non-recommended item, U.S. Congress, was adopted at the National Convention. Ars. Dakin will be chairman of this item. Population will now be more strongly emphasized in the environmental ite . A by-law change was approved which allows 18 year olds to be members of League. Mon-recommended items may now pass by a majority vote. Action to protect the right to vote of every citizen was also added to the by-laws. Mational League will go on fiscal year July this year. Fiftieth Anniversary Drive will continue another year with all soliciting being done by National Board. 8) Excerpts from Convention banquet speeches were passed around for those interested to read. 9) A letter was passed around from Senator Ralph Tyler Swith which was his response to the Electoral College Rive for Action. 10) Wrs. Beck attended a luncheon sponsored by WDZ for promotion of Project 70. We distributed pamphlets to all members promoting the week long program. 11) A thank you note was received from Janet Heilman for the gift given to her when she word. 12) Hrs. Gerald Cox attended the Day Care meeting May 6 in East St. Louis. Her report was read.

Twelve copies of a flyer on starting day care centers will be ordered and distributed to large churches in Decatur. Ars. Kessler will decide who gets the flyers. 13) Springfield Voter was passed around. It included an article on college protests.

PROGRAM: Mrs. Kessler may come at a later date to present an idea concerning child welfare.

Schools: A statement was made at the May 7 School Board Meeting. A copy is filed with the minutes.

The School Com ittee is drawing up a fact sheet to point out changes in schools over the fast few years because of plans. It will include a statement of goals, etc. made for the school system in June, 1967. It will also state enroll ent figures (total enrollment, no. of black) for *69, *70, & *71 school year; number being transferred between schools (no. of black) and no. of children making two and three changes in past three years. Would like to include achieve ent rate with what per cent of the total school population is in low achieving schools and what per cent of black in low achieving schools. It was moved, seconded, and passed to proceed with the fact sheet for members and media.

Mrs. Schade spoke to Preston Exing, Regional Director of NAACP. He says precedent for cout action concerning Decatur's redistricting plan will be Denver, Colorada All that must be done is to prove that the new plan is not promoting integration.

Imman Resources: Printed aterial was sent to all members not attending the all member meeting. The committee will continue working through the surmer since they will have a Fall consensus.

Con Con: Ten rembers went to Con Con, Tues. May 19. One problem is Mr. Dove and Mrs. Smith cancel each other's vote on judicial item.

A request was received from State that we hold an open meeting with both Con Con delegates in the Fall. This is being considered for an open evening meeting.

PUBLIC RELATIONS: Voted to send a senior high school girl to Con Con fouth Observers Day, June 24: 25. Cout will be \$20.00 and transportation. High School Social Studies Depts. will be contacted for names of interested and qualified girls. One will be chosen by drawing name from a hat.
