 - c) Other? (describe) Our two units were agreed on 2 (b). One unit felt it did not matter if partisan and non-partisan elections were consolidated. The other had the following suggestions: one date each year for primaries, with the partisan primaries in even years and non-partisan in odd Feltections of non-partisan and partisan candidates also kept separation the continuous Board members elected at the same time as County officials. School elections to be held every other year, with primaties preceding such elections by six weeks if more than two candidates run for the same position. The two units were equal as to number participating. The specific suggestions from Unit 2 did not come up for discussion in Unit 1.
