The meeting was held at the home of Millie Protzman and was preceded by a salad supper. Twenty-two members and two guests were present.

President Kathleen Owen noted the death of League member and former board member. Kathleen Beck, on May 16.

The Annual Meeting was called to order at 7:25PM by the president. A quorum was present. Members and guests were introduced.

Roberts Rules of Order were adopted. Laura Verbanac was appointed Parliamentarian and Lucille Crow Secretary for the meeting. Ann Limerick and Marian Woyna will serve as a committee to approve the minutes of the meeting.

Past president Agnita Dupree, who is leaving Decatur, was honored with tributes and gifts. A fifty dollar donation was made to local Planned Parenthood to be used for Public Policy. Agnita's new address: Givens Estates, Villa 24E, Asheville, N.C. 28800.

Report on Illinois State Convention held May 15 and 16, was given by delegates President Owen, Ellen Spycher and Lauri Thornton. Convention passed a new study to set up new guidelines on State Legislative redistricting. Support for Public School System study will be emphasized. Joint priority action items passed were Tax Reform and Early Intervention for Children at Risk. These will be priority items for action focus but are not for mandatory study. Non recommended items passed: (1) Over-thau1 of election laws to provide automatic recounts in close elections. (2) Change 1970 Constitution to eliminate flat rate income tax and provide graduated income tax.

Treasurer's Report. Sue Marshall reported balance on July 1,1992 of \$2,096.87. Present balance is \$2,016.68. Motion was made and seconded to increase local membership dues to \$40. Motion carried. This will leave \$4.50 for local use after State and National per member payments. It was noted that if dues are a hardship for anyone, financial help is available by action of the board.

Audit Report: Alice Dakin and Sue Marshall will audit this past year's financial reports.

1993-94 Budget. Chairman Barbara Ohlsen was unable to be present. Sue Marshall presented the proposed budget. Note was made that substantial increases were projected for conventions. It is felt that benefits by local delegates were worth the additional costs. Motion was made and seconded to accept budget as proposed. Motion carried. Copy of 1993-94 budget is attached.

Adoption of Local Program. Kathy Sorensen, Vice-President, Program, announced that no local studies had been proposed. No proposals were made from the floor.Present program: County and Township Governments, Decatur's Environmental Quality, City Government, and Decatur Public Schools. A motion was made and seconded to amend Decatur Public Schools item to add: "An updated study conducted 1991-93 confirms the above positions." Motion carried. A motion to approve Local Program for 1993-94 as amended carried.

Several members recommended that the Water Study Program be emphasized during the coming year. This item is under Decatur's Environmental Quality.

Announcements: President Owen asked members to give immediate action on legislative items now being decided in the State Legislature. Oppose Senate Bill 85 which would take away local control over the use of pesticides and give it to the State. Oppose bills to determine mandatory tax caps. Oppose Senate Bill 209 and House Bill 1300, Parental notification bills for abortions by minors.

Sue Marshall announced that we now have 46 members with nine new members during the past year. She asked that dues for 1993-94 (due Sept 1) be paid early to help with compiling our 1993-94 year book.

No summer coffee has been scheduled but one may be planned for Aug.

School Study Chairman Cindy Reynolds announced an Ad Hoc meeting May 20, regarding proposed referendum to increase local school funding.

Alice Dakin stated that League will plan to work early on voter registration, perhaps thru local school organizations, to help pass a possible tax increase referendum in November.
