#### LEAGUE OF WOLLEN VOTERS

#### October 15, 1970

The neeting was held at the home of Krs. Robert Dumas, 1346 W. Kacon with President, Krs. Robert Schade presiding.

PRESENT: Nesdames Schade, Meyerson, Dumas, Coberly, Butler, Ohlsen, Hughes, Weinman, Panetti, Lauterjung, Hardy, Lants, and Crow.

ABSENT: Hesdames Verbanac and Forbes.

HIMTES: Approved as uritten.

TREASURERS REPORT: Balance on hand 3793.07. M.H.S. Acct. \$289.22. Accepted and filed for audit.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: 1) The National Treasurers Report was passed around. 2) League is becoming more involved as a legal advocacy. As a form of action on some program items, briefs are being filed as a friend of the court. It was noted that this was sometimes done in school integration cases. 3) A form was received from State concerning the convention and cutting costs for such. The Board discussed expenses for six delegates and the President, h) Annual reports from Citizens Information Service were given to those interested. 5) Issues of "The Voice" were passed around in which League was commended for its recent action in disclosing school racial imbalance. 6) Publicity from the "Decatur Review" concerning the Anti-Pollution Bond Act was also passed around. 7) Mrs. Schade attended a meeting called by Manker Harris about the plans and funding for a program for voter education and registration. 8) Tuesday, October 22 and 29 on WIMA Radio at 10:00, the Cha paign County League is presenting a program on United Nations and the coming elections. 9) A flyer "It's Your Country" and its cover letter was passed around.

NEW BUSINESS: Mrs. David Marshall was to be asked to serve on the nominating committee, but it was discovered that she is already on the committee for this year. Mrs. Robert Butler has agreed to replace Mrs. Westenhaver.

Mrs. Dumas will find two discussion leaders and two recorders for Decatur Schools consensus units.

Some material concerning Human desources was read to and approved by the Board to go into the Voter.
