With deepest admiration, we, the Senior Class of 1967, dedicate our Zionois to our coach, Mr. Kenneth Parks.



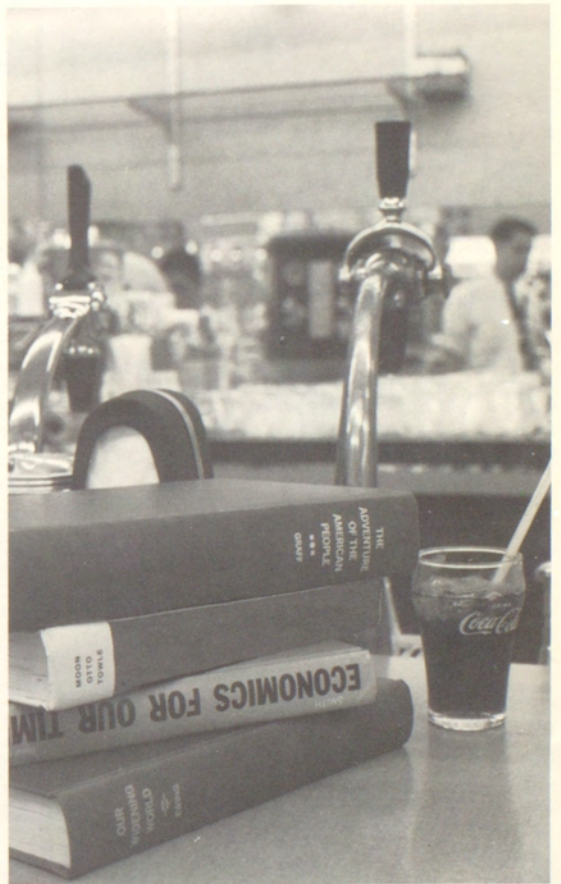
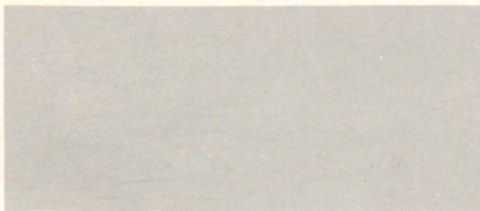
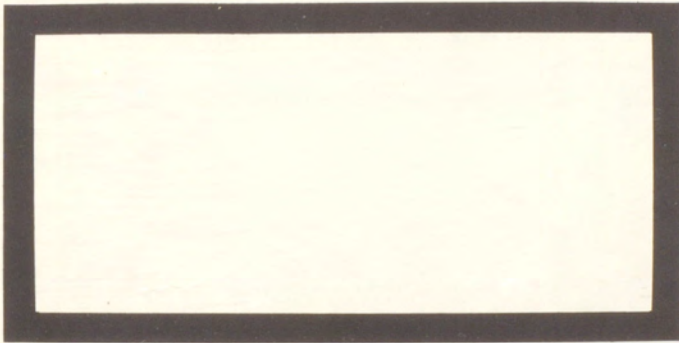
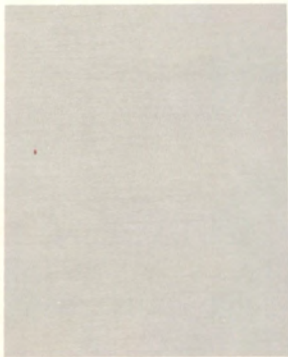

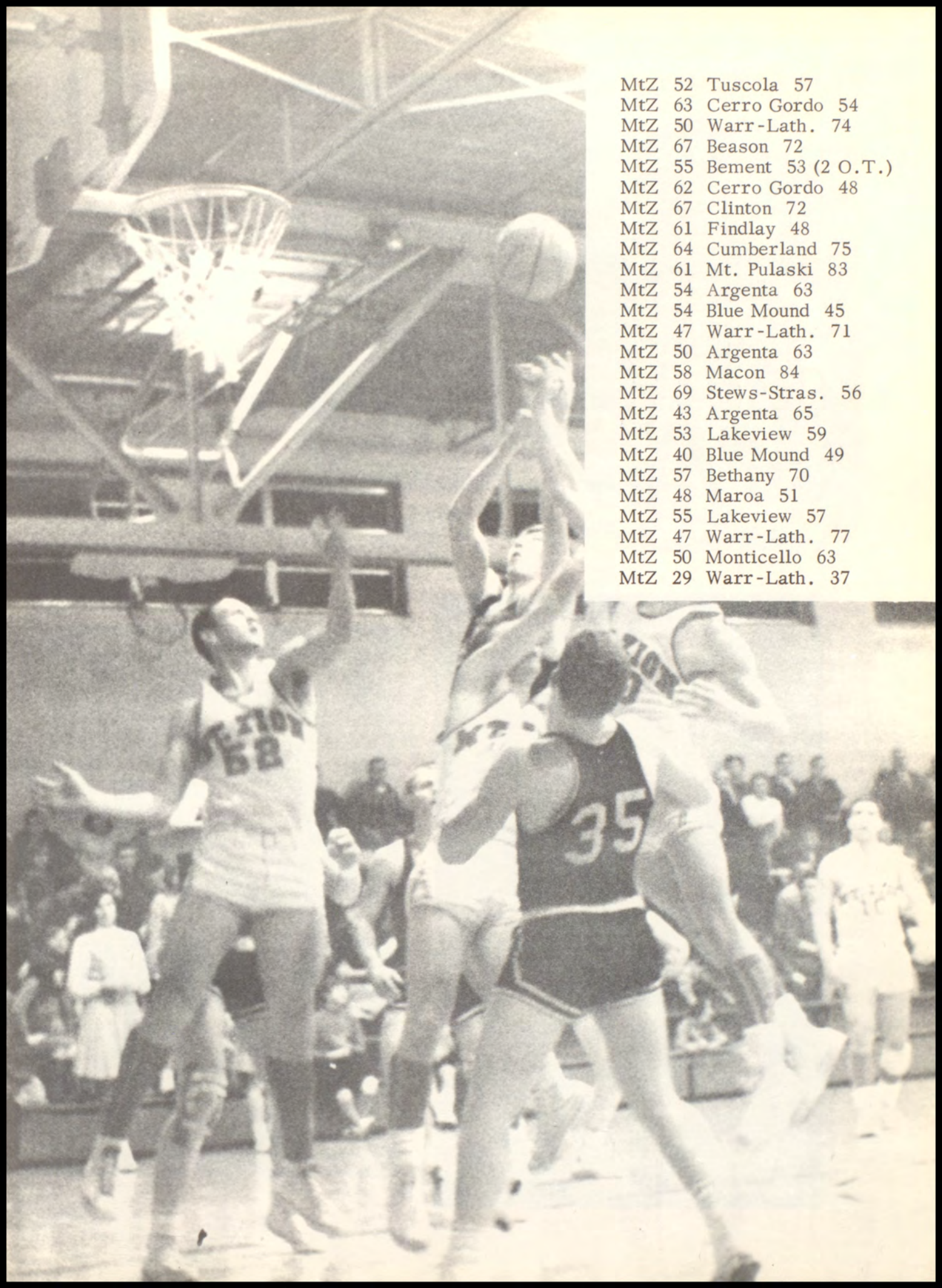
Cross Country
