June 30, 1971

The neeting was held at the home of hirs. Gerald Redford, 1553 W. Hain, with President, Mrs. Ohlsen, presiding.

PRESENT: Mosdames Ohlsen, Weinman, Moyerson, Verbanac, Coberly, Butler, McVay, Forbes, Schade, Cook, Marshall, and Redford,

TREASURERS REFORT: Cash on Hand 6-30-71 3561.62 H.H.S. Acct . \$301.05.

AMMOUNCE LAME: 1) A new was received from Mational concerning Mational Council. Noither a resolution or an emergency item was adopted related to the Viet Nan situation. Fiftieth Anniversary figures were passed around. 2) A news release co neerning colid wastes was passed around. 3) A program conference will be held in Chicago on October 13. Subjects will be Civil Righ ts and Liberties and U. S. Congress . 4) Consensus questions on Day Care have arrived. 5) The Education Fund has received a large grant from the Ford Foundation which will enable it to start two new programs. One, in partnership with the National Hunicipal League, will be to conduct an election systems survey. The second is the establishment of a Department of Litigation. 6) A Time For Action was received concerning moves to water down HRL, the wolfare bill. A state ent of position was included and a request for letters to congression was made. Hirs. Ohlsen has lots of welfare reform information for anyone wanting to read it. 7) It was suggested there be a press release concerning the right to vote for 18 year olds. 8) A newsletter was received from the Charber of Con erce. It included a membership application for the Sangaron Valley Association along with a request that we reproduce it in our next Voter for those interested in joining. Decision was postponed until time for the next Voter. 9) Hrs. Ohlson made a statement on behalf of League at the Bakalis public hearings on public education. The statement was passed around. The hearings are to be a basis for drafting a state plan for public education to be presented at a conference in September or October. 10) hrs. Ohlsen and hrs. Schade participated in a president's training session in Springfield on June 17. 11) Programment will writ a letters for Time's For Action from League and the President will sign them. Copies must be sent to State. On national items a copy goes to both Stat e and National. 12) The President's Letter only may be ordered for JL.00. Decided not to order any since three copies are presently received with President's mailings.

13) Discussion was held concerning the need for a historian. Currently t he publicity chairman does this job. 14) An interesting voters guide was included in the Peoria League's Bulletin. It is similar to the blue center pages of our yearbook but much were complete.

15) "This Is What We Can Do For You", a phamplet put out by the Springfield League was passed around. 16) "Home Rule and The Local Official", a new publication was passed around. A few copies are in the suitcase. 17) Two non-League publications were received and are available to anyone interested. Counterbudget and Knowledge Into Action - Improving The Use Of The Hation's Social Sciences were donated by the Hational Urban Coalition and Russell Sandage Foundation.

MEN BUSHIESS: A resignation was received and approved from Lrs. Roger Hiller as no minating chairman for the coming year.

A tentative date for board training session was set for Sept. 22. It was suggested that we ask for discussion of State Board and local relationship with speaking on items other than local ones. Will also request hillie Cohn, the downstate chairman.
