



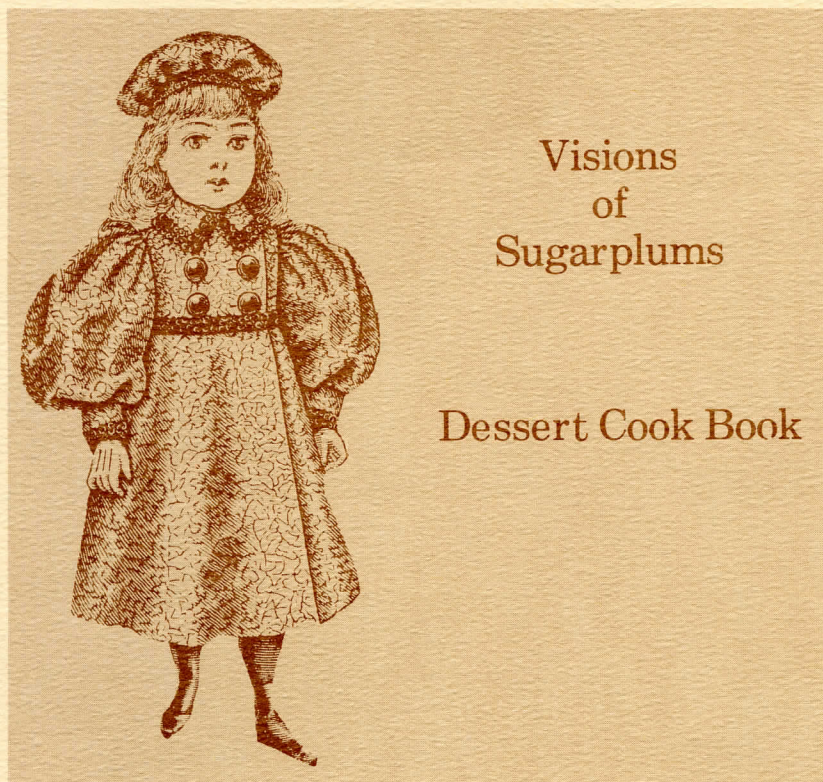

Dessert Cook Book

This is the time of year to try a new way of using a few of our tasty Illinois apples.

To help you find just the right recipe, we're sharing one from **Visions of Sugarplums**, the delightful dessert cook book published by the James Millikin Homestead.

Applesauce Cookies

- | | |
|-----------------------|------------------------|
| 2 cups flour, sifted | 1/2 cup shortening |
| 1/2 teaspoon salt | 1 cup sugar |
| 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg | 1 teaspoon baking soda |
| 1/2 teaspoon cloves | 1 cup applesauce |
| 1 cup chopped nuts | 1 egg, well beaten |
| 1 cup chopped raisins | |

Sift together flour, salt and spices; add nuts and raisins. Cream shortening; add sugar gradually and continue to beat until light. Stir soda into applesauce. Add egg; combine with creamed mixture. Add dry ingredients. Drop by teaspoon onto greased baking sheet. Bake in moderate oven (350°) 15 to 20 minutes. Makes about 4 dozen.

Beginning Dec. 5 and running through Dec. 21, the Santa House tours are open to tots and anyone who's young at heart. Tuesday through Friday hours are 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Saturday hours are 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Santa will be resting on Sundays and Mondays.

Twelve costumed elves will lead 40-minute tours beginning in the Carriage House. Children will be given a choice of working on a variety of craft projects there. Next stop: the Homestead Bicentennial Room, where Raggedy Ann will narrate a puppet show. Santa Claus will be the star attraction in the dining room, and Mrs. Claus will pass out cookies in the kitchen. An early 1900's theme will be carried out.

SINCE YOU ASKED . . .

Volunteers conducting tours through the James Millikin Homestead are asked a variety of questions about the home and its owner. These are frequently heard:

Q. Where are the Millikins buried?

A. Anna and James Millikin were laid to rest in Greenwood Cemetery, which borders Lincoln Park. The mausoleum is marked "Aston-Millikin." He died in 1909 and she, in 1913.

Q. Why are the stained glass windows called "oriel"?

A. This word is a derivation of the French word for porch. It meant a large bay window projecting from a wall and supported from the exterior by a bracket. The oriel window in the Homestead was added in the 1903 remodeling of the house.

Q. Why are there niches and alcoves in Victorian stairways?

A. These were most common in homes of that period since they allowed more space to maneuver heavy Victorian furniture up and down the staircase.

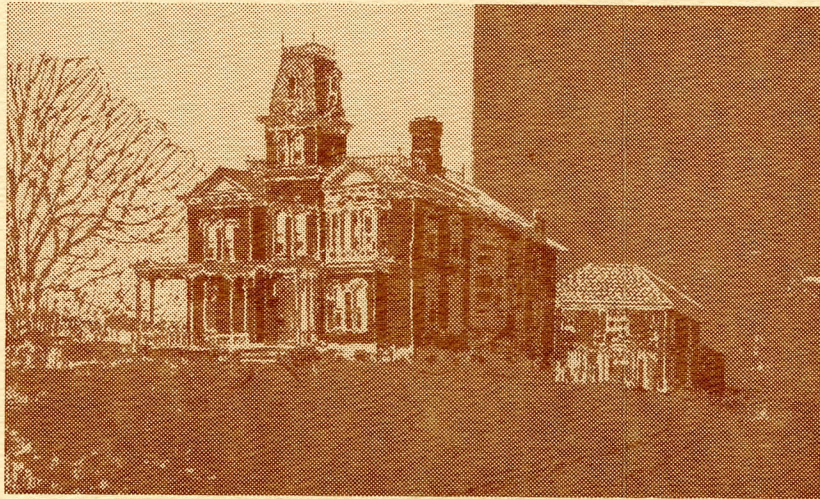
Q. How much do you charge for a group to meet in the Homestead?

A. The cost for a tour or meeting depends on the size of the group, with \$15 being the charge for groups under 20 in number. Susan Shade (422-1709) can give you more specific information and schedule your visit.
