#### COMBINED BOARD MEETING

## March 18, 1970

PRESENT: Mesdames Schade, Beck, Meyerson, Coberly, Johnson, Colvis, Day, Lauterjung, Greive, and Hippler.

ABSENT: Mesdames Heilman, Bowers, Verbanar, Westenhaver, Crow, Mughes, Panetti, Hardy, and Butler.

MINUTES: Approved as written.

NEI BUSINES: Mrs. Frank Verbance sub littled her resignation as an elected director so that she may actively participate in campaigning for the school board election. She will continue in her capacity as human Resources chair mn. Her resignation was accepted.

A.E.OUICA.LITS: 1) A clip ing from the Decatur Tribune of the coverage of ir. values speech and other recent news stories was passed around. 2) Hrs. Schude and the school condittee chose irs. Fanetti to speak on the panel concerning issues of the coming school election held at First .ethodist Charch. 3) Fifty "Time for Action" sheets were distributed at the school neeting concerning the Stennis mend ent. 4) Letters written by hrs. Jeck on the Moctoral College "Ti me for Action's have brought many replies from senators around the country. These were passed around. 5) Petitions advocating a vote for D.C. citizens are being circulated for signatures. Deadline is April 23. He bors are asked to take petitions to other organization meetings. Contact Mrs. Reverson for more petitions.
6) League's foreign aid position has been delayed, however, preliminary appraisal indicates no significant shift in position. 7) A long explanation was received from lational as to thy they cut over the budget.

It might be good in the fall for a meeting closer to election time. 16) Mrs. Heilman is moving to Scottsburg, Indiana, April 1.
