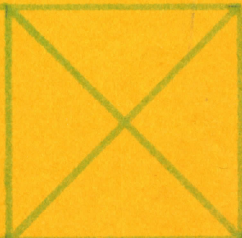

LEAGUE PRINCIPLES

(Concepts of government, supported by the League as a whole, which constitute the authorization for adoption of national, state, and local Program.)

The League of Women Voters believes in representative government and in the individual liberties established in the Constitution of the United States.

The League of Women Voters believes that democratic government depends upon the informed and active participation of its citizens.

The League of Women Voters believes that every citizen should be protected in his right to vote; that every person should have access to free public education which provides equal opportunity for all; and that no person or group should suffer legal, economic, or administrative discrimination.

The League of Women Voters believes that efficient and economical government requires competent personnel, the clear assignment of responsibility, adequate financing, and coordination among the different agencies.

The League of Women Voters believes that responsible government should be responsive to the will of the people; that government should maintain an equitable and flexible system of taxation, promote the conservation and development of natural resources in the public interest, share in the solution of economic and social problems which affect the general welfare, promote a stable and expanding economy, and adopt domestic policies which facilitate the solution of international problems.

The League of Women Voters believes that cooperation with other nations is essential in the search for solutions to world problems, and that the development of international organization and international law is imperative in the promotion of world peace.

PROGRAM FOR STUDY AND ACTION

"Program" in the League of Women Voters means government issues which members have chosen to consider and on which they may act after thorough study and discussion and after consensus of the membership is reached.

Program selection at all three levels (local, state, and national) begins with suggestions by individual members. From these suggestions the appropriate board prepares a proposed program on which members vote - personally on local program at their League's Annual Meeting, and through delegates to conventions on state and national program.

At Annual Meetings and Conventions proposed items are adopted, reworded and adopted, or not adopted. Any item suggested previously (but not on the proposed program) may be considered and adopted.

 - Evaluation of the fair housing ordinance in Decatur.

3. Decatur Public Schools
 - Support of increased funds to provide quality education and adequate space.
 - Study ways to improve public education in Decatur.
4. Decatur's Water Resources and Sewer Systems
 - Study of Decatur's water resources and sewer systems.

5. Council-Manager Form of City Government
 - Support for the continuation of Council-Manager form of government for the city of Decatur.

STATE PROGRAM FOR 1967-1969
(Adopted at State Convention, April 18-20, 1967)

1. Study and action to revise the structure of Illinois government to include:
 - A Constitutional Convention for Illinois.
 - A study of the Legislative and Executive Articles.
 - A new Revenue Article and measures to obtain an adequate and flexible tax structure.
 - Annual sessions for the Illinois General Assembly.
 - A short ballot, electing only policy-making officials.
 - Improved and clarified election laws and procedures.
 - Protection of the 1962 Judicial Amendment and support of measures to further judicial reform.
2. Protection of the individual in his civil rights and liberties.
 - Support of state legislation to provide equal housing opportunities.
 - Support of legislation to equalize employment opportunities.
 - Preservation of constitutional liberties.
3. Support of improved local, regional and statewide welfare services by Illinois state agencies serving children and their families.
4. Study of local governmental structure within Illinois
 - Emphasis on study of schools to include structure of school systems, the relationship of schools to the state, the relationship of school districts to each other, and the financing of schools - through local, state, and federal funding programs.

NATIONAL PROGRAM 1968-1970

(As adopted by the 28th National Convention, May, 1968)

1. Electoral College.
 - A study of the Electoral College
2. Human Resources
 - Support of equality of opportunity for education, employment and housing.
 - Evaluation of means to achieve equality of opportunity for housing and of further measures to combat poverty and discrimination.
3. Foreign Policy
 - Evaluation of U.S. relations with People's Republic of China.
 - Support of U.S. policies to strengthen the peacekeeping and peacebuilding capacities of the U.N. system and to promote world trade and development while maintaining a sound U.S. economy.
4. Water Resources
 - Support of national policies and procedures which promote comprehensive long-range planning for conservation and development of water resources and improvement of water quality.
5. Tax Rates and Treaty Making
 - Opposition to constitutional limitation on tax rates. Opposition to constitutional changes that would limit the existing powers of the Executive and the Congress over foreign relations.
6. Representative Government
 - Apportionment
 - Support of apportionment of both houses of state legislatures substantially on population.
 - District of Columbia
 - Support of self-government and representation in congress for citizens of the District of Columbia.

ELECTION DAYS

Primary: Second Tuesday in June.

General: First Tuesday after the first Monday in November in even-numbered years.

City Primary: Held six weeks before the city election if more than two petition to run for any position.

City: Third Tuesday in April in odd-numbered years.

School Board: Second Saturday in April every year.

Park District: First Tuesday in April in odd-numbered years.

Township: First Tuesday in April in odd-numbered years.

Sanitary District and Mosquito Abatement District: Board members are appointed by the Chief Judge of the Circuit Court.

VOTING REQUIREMENTS

1. 21 years of age or older
2. A citizen of the United States
3. Resident of: Illinois - one year
County - 90 days, Precinct - 30 days
4. Registered at time of election

Special legislation is in effect which allows a newcomer to the state (of less than a year's residence) to vote for President and Vice-President only. He must reside in Illinois for 60 days preceding the election (that is, he must have moved here before Sept. 6, 1968) and must have been a qualified voter in another state. This also applies to residents moving from one county to another within the state where they have not fulfilled the 90 day requirement.

WHERE AND WHEN TO REGISTER

Voters' Registration Office, Macon County Building, 253 E. Wood Street, any time except 28 days before and 2 days after a primary or general election.

The League of Women Voters is a non-partisan organization. The League never supports nor opposes any candidate nor any party. The League does support issues which have been thoroughly studied and on which the membership has arrived at consensus.
