LEAGUE PRINCIPLES

(Concepts of government, supported by the League as a whole, which constitute the authorization for adoption of national, state, and local Program.)

The League of Women Voters believes in representative government and in the individual liberties established in the Constitution of the United States.

The League of Women Voters believes that democratic government depends upon the informed and active participation of its citizens.

The League of Women Voters believes that every citizen should be protected in his right to vote; that every person should have access to free public education which provides equal opportunity for all; and that no person or group should suffer legal, economic, or administrative discrimination.

The League of Women Voters believes that efficient and economical government requires competent personnel, the clear assignment of responsibility, adequate financing, and coordination among the different agencies.

The League of Women Voters believes that responsible government should be responsive to the will of the people; that government should maintain an equitable and flexible system of taxation, promote the conservation and development of natural resources in the public interest, share in the solution of economic and social problems which affect the general welfare, promote a stable and expanding economy, and adopt domestic policies which facilitate the solution of international problems.

The League of Women Voters believes that cooperation with other nations is essential in the search for solutions to world problems, and that the development of international organization and international law is imperative in the promotion of world peace.

PROGRAM FOR STUDY AND ACTION

"program" in the League of Women Voters means government issues which members have chosen to consider and on which they may act after thorough study and discustion and after consensus of the membership is reached.

Program selection at all three levels (local, state, and national) begins with suggestions by individual members. From these suggestions the appropriate board prepares a proposed program on which members vote - personally on local program at their League's Annual Meeting, and through delegates to conventions on state and national program.

At Annual Meetings and Conventions proposed items are adopted, reworded and adopted, or not adopted. Any item suggested previously (but not on the proposed program) may be considered and adopted.

VOTING REQUIREMENTS

1. 21 years of age or older

2. A citizen of the United States

3. Resident of: Illinois - one year County - 90 days, Precinct - 30 days

4. Registered at time of election

Special legislation is in effect which allows a new-comer to the state (of less than a year's residence) to vote for President and Vice-President only. He must reside in Illinois for 60 days preceding the election (that is, he must have moved here before Sept. 6, 1968) and must have been a qualified voter in another state. This also applies to residents moving from one county to another within the state where they have not fulfilled the 90 day requirement.

WHERE AND WHEN TO REGISTER

Voters' Registration Office, Macon County Building, 253 E. Wood Street, any time except 28 days before and 2 days after a primary or general election.

The League of Women Voters is a non-partisan organization. The League never supports nor opposes any candidate nor any party. The League does support issues which have been thoroughly studied and on which the membership has arrived at consensus.
