All Car Lines center at Transfer Station, Lincoln Square, where passengers transfer for the different lines.

ALL LINES Loop the Loop going east on Main to Water, north on Water to North (except Riverside), and then diverging to the different lines. Returning all lines reach Transfer Station by coming south on North Main from North Street.
