Thus, there have been four families to occupy the house at 346 W. Macon, 1875-1974.

* It is known that numbers were later reassigned, and since Recorder of Deeds Office data shows the Wallaces to have owned the property described above, it is presumed that #8 became 346 W. Macon. Evidence that #8 Macon was the same structure as the one now standing at 346 W. Macon, is the fact that there are "8's" on each glass panel at thetop of the big front door.

Present owner's name: Martin and Ann Seidman.

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- 3. Mrs. Emily Johnson Metzler, daughter of the J. D. Johnson's, recalls (July 1, 1974), that her father employed Frank Bobb, a well-known contractor in his day, to do extensive remodeling before the Johnsons moved into the house. Mr. Bobb, she said, added some of the "do-dads" on the exterior.
- 4. Mrs. D. S. Shellabarger recalled in an interview in December, 1973, that "the J. J. Johnson house is a very old house, which they stuccoed at the time of their purchase of it."


