

MINUTES OF BOARD MEETING
LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS, DECATUR, ILLINOIS
MAY 5, 1960

The Program development and Evaluation sheet was discussed by the board and filled in.

Revenue workshop will be an all-day meeting on May 26 to hear the report by Mrs. Ferber of Champaign. The June board meeting will be a potluck at 11:30 in Mrs. Hein's home.

Mrs. Kessinger was asked to write a letter of commendation to the Mayor and City Council. The Publications chairman will have material for the next month's program at the unit meetings. Mrs. Gibson said the finance drive may start earlier this year.

After discussion it was decided to print a mimeographed membership list to go out with the May bulletin. Perhaps there can be a printed program next year for the members.

10 women and 20 men are needed for crowd scenes in the Macon Co. Historical Pageant. If interested, let Mrs. Kessinger know.

The Know-Your-County booklet is going to the printer.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
