







Congratulations to Ray Snelson for being chosen the "Most Valuable Player" and captain of this year's team. Ray was also selected to be on the Central Conference All Stars.







In competition with annuals submitted in State, Sectional, even National contests, since 1906, Huston-Patterson yearbooks have been rated tops — year, after year, after year.


