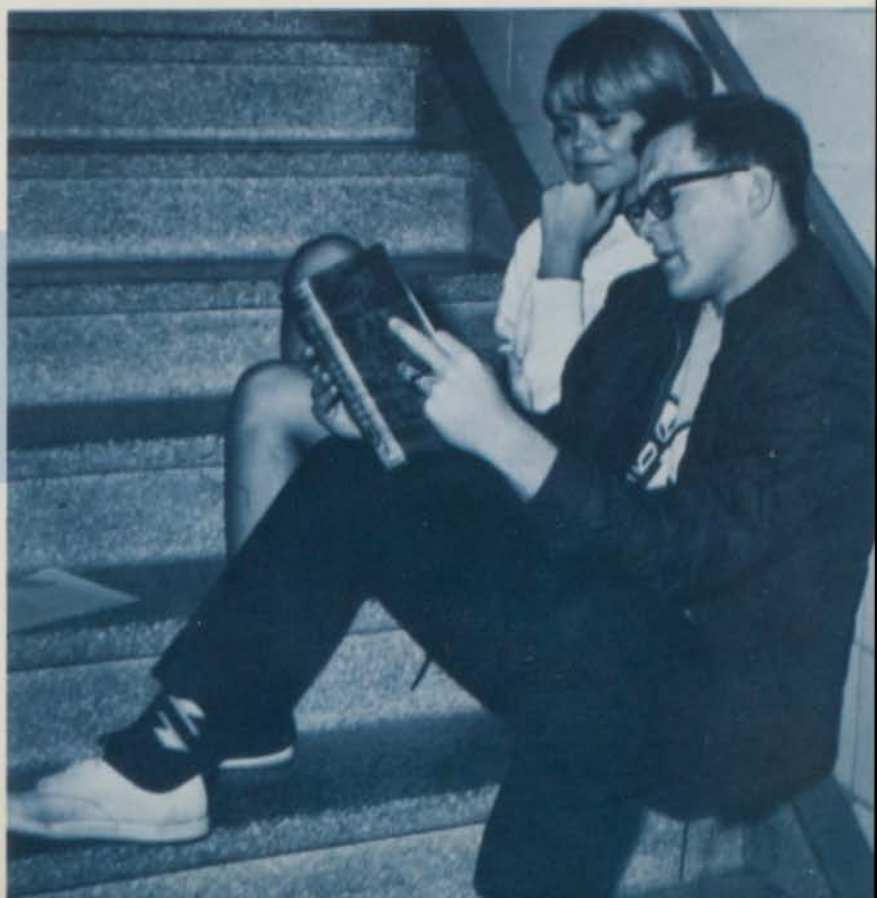
A Generation in a Hurry

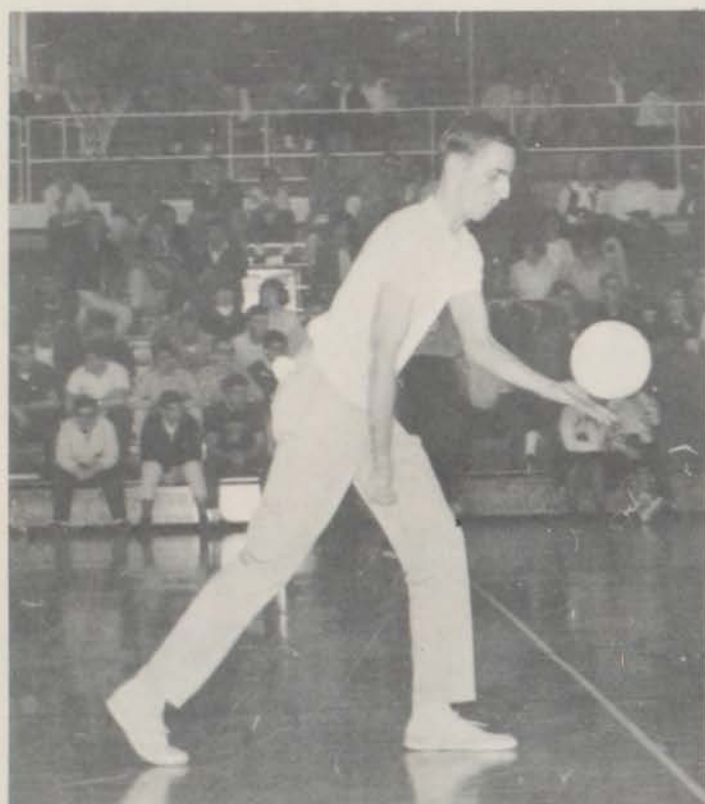

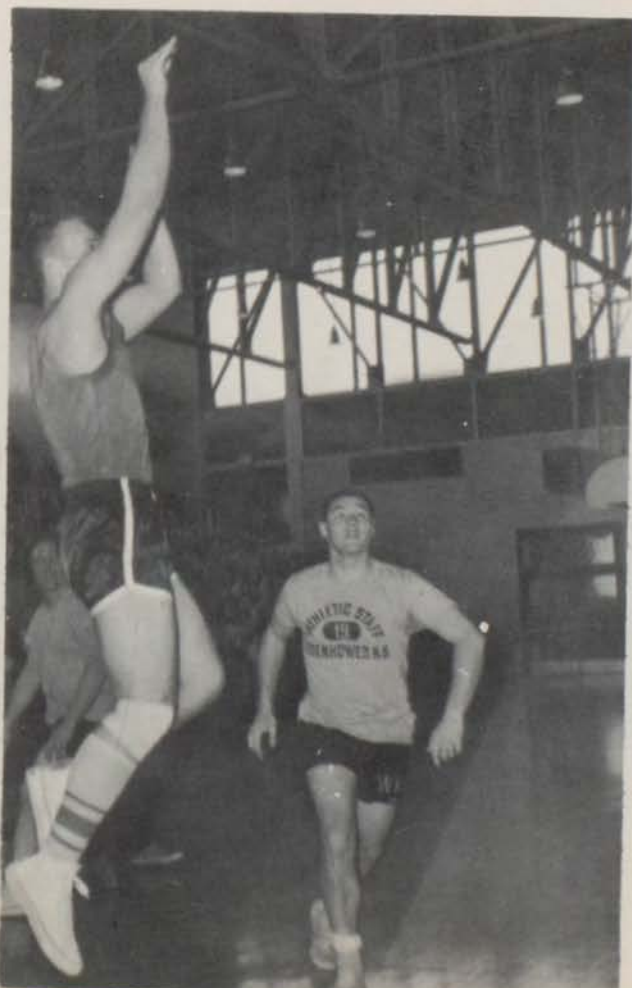

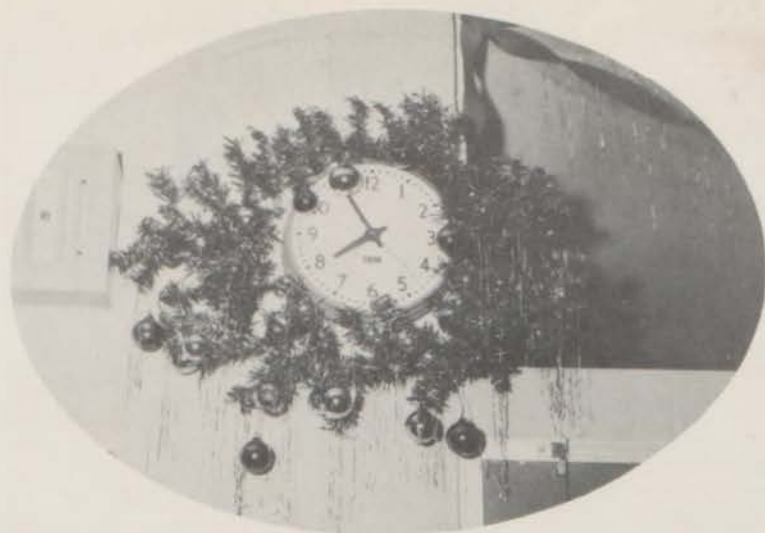

Clock decorated for Christmas

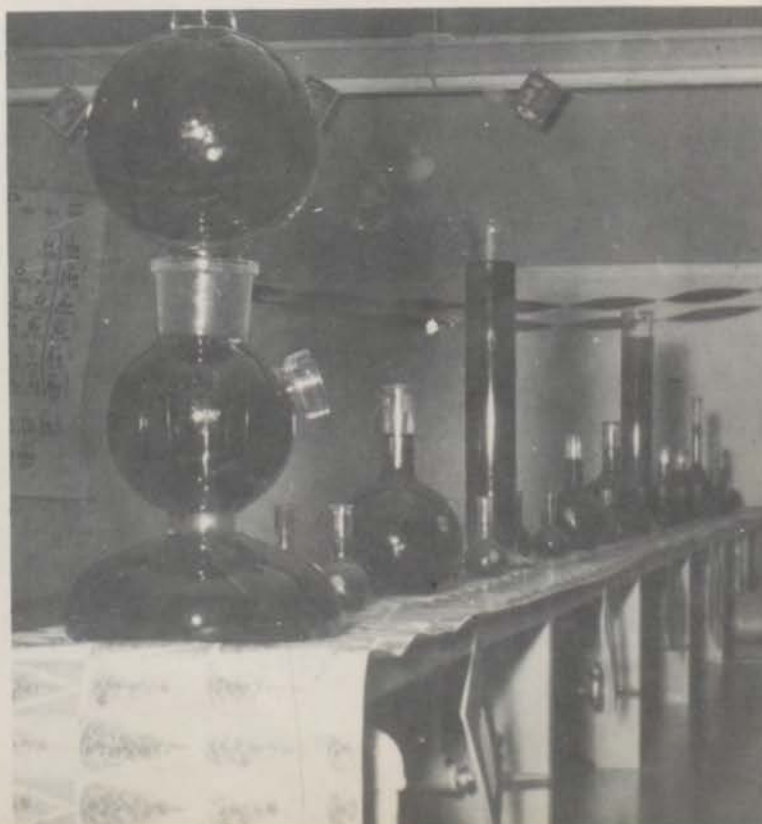

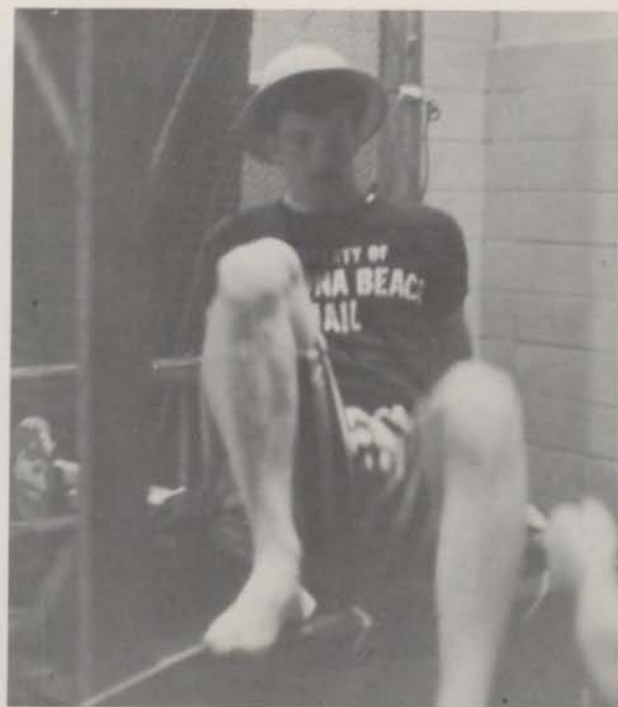

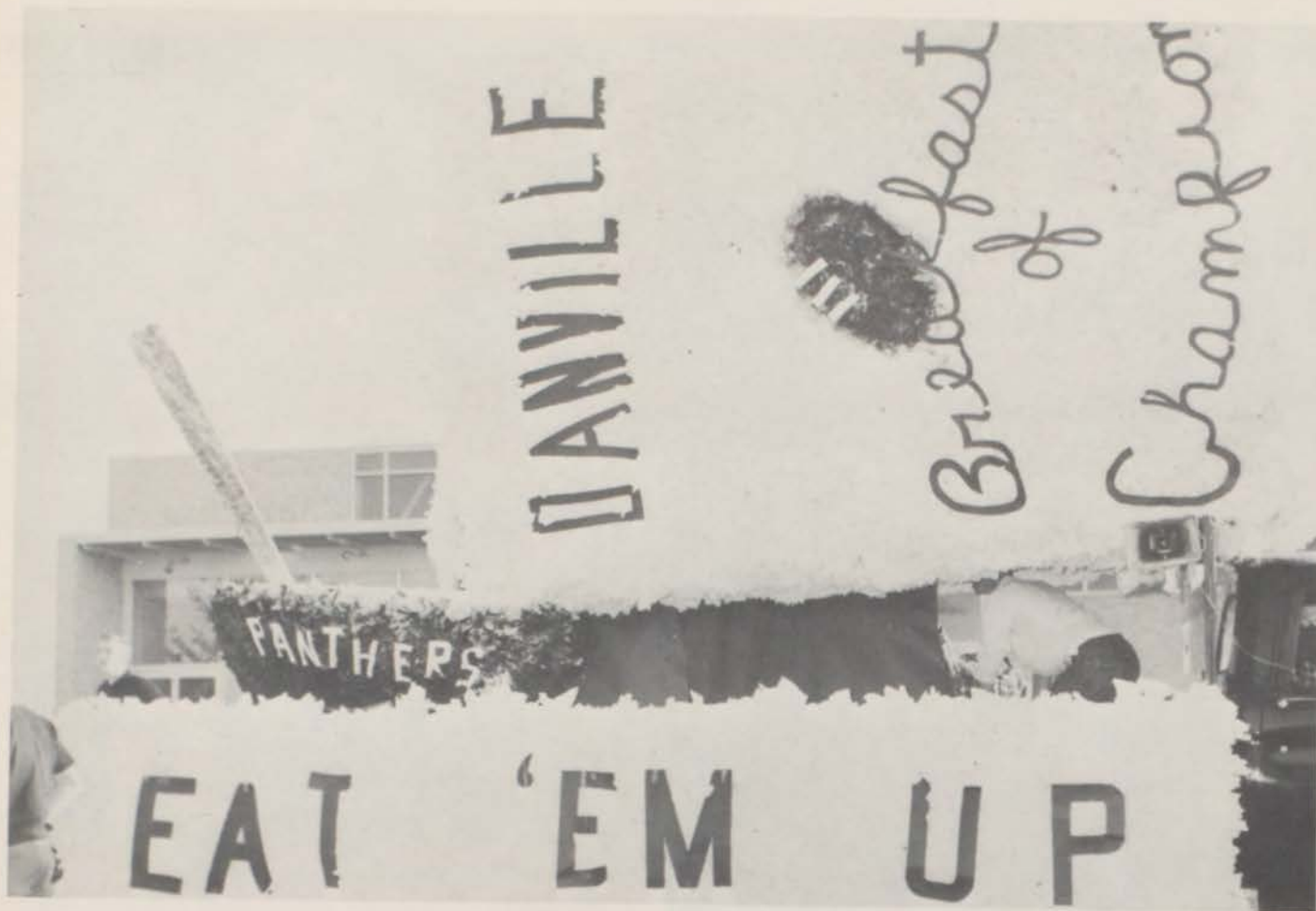

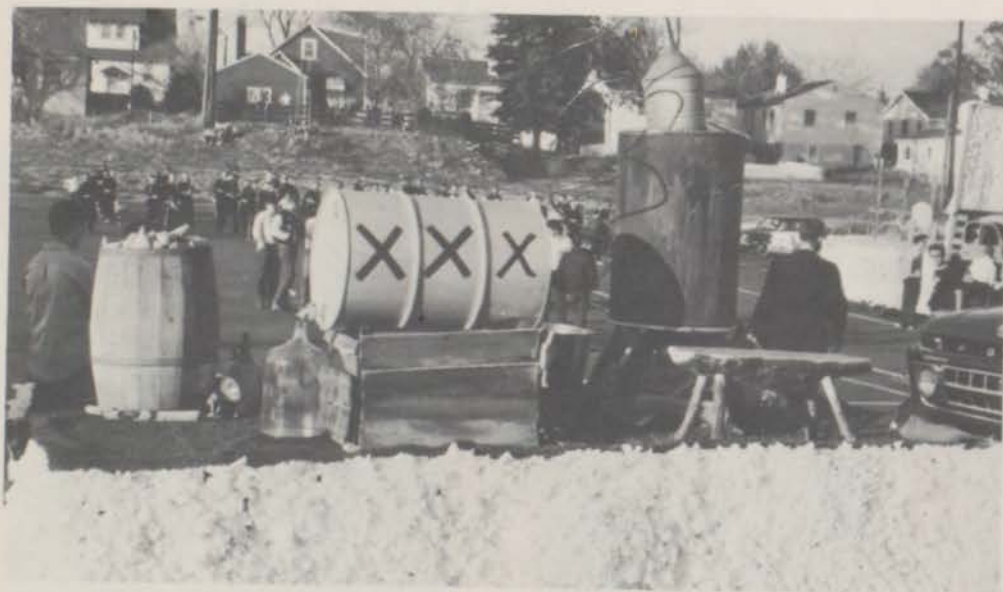

The management of Eisenhower was changed this year by the addition of the IBM data processing equipment to the Decatur school system. The students were introduced to this new system when they received their class schedules at the beginning of school. At this time, the students also learned they were to be referred to as numbers. The speed and accuracy of this system makes it both practical and efficient. Scheduling the 1,600 Eisenhower students took about 6 minutes! Report cards are also a product of the IBM system. Five copies are made for each student, of which four are kept by the "V.I.P.'s."

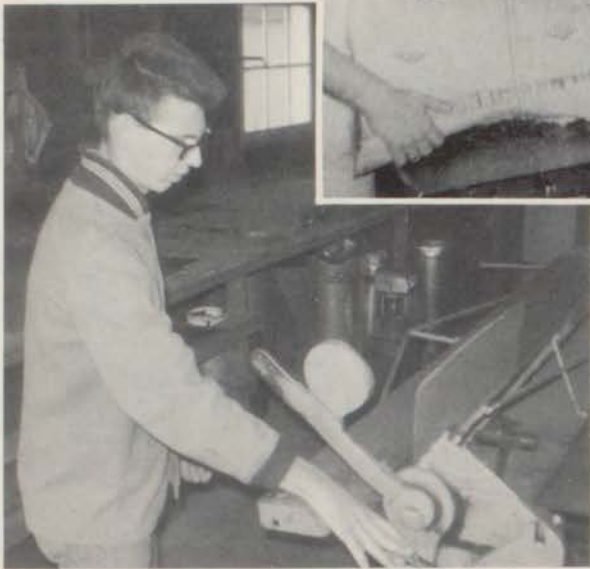

The Panthers finished their regular season play with a 22-4 record in 1965, Eisenhower's finest year since 1957. Highlights of the season were victories over highly rated Collinsville, Quincy, and the two one point victories over Jacksonville, the second giving the Panthers its first Capitol Conference title.

With six returning lettermen Eisenhower was figured to have an excellent team. It was the third year of varsity basketball for Dave McCrary, Booker Horges and Dale Stevens. The other two starting positions were filled by John Eubanks senior forward, and Carl Jenkins, junior guard. The combination of Horges and Jenkins was one of the fastest guard duos in the state. Backing up this first quintet were two seniors, Phil

Neeves and Stuart Baker, and eight Juniors.

Eisenhower opened its season at home by ending Mt. Pulaski's five-game winning streak. An easy victory over Griffin was followed by a one point victory at Jacksonville. The Panthers then suffered their first loss at the hands of Springfield High. This loss was overshadowed by victories at home against Collinsville and Quincy. At the time of the victories these two opponents were rated 11th and 2nd, respectively, in the state.

The Christmas holidays took the team to Southern Illinois University and the Carbondale tournament. Eisenhower won its first two games against Canton and Sparta, but lost in the semi-finals to Carbondale.

Following the holidays the Panthers won six in a row, including victories over Lanphier, Charleston, Normal, and Paris. The Panthers won their first two games in the city tournament over MacArthur and St. Teresa but then lost the third game to Decatur in an overtime. They took second in the tourney by beating Lakeview the final night. Warrensburg and Griffin were Eisenhower's next victims and then Jacksonville came to Eisenhower for a rematch. The game went into overtime with the Panthers winning once again by one point.

The Panthers were dealt their fourth loss of the season when they ventured down south and faced Wood River. The Panthers had little trouble downing Lakeview and MacArthur in their first two games of the regional; but they were stopped with a heartbreaking defeat at the hands of the Running Reds in the final game.

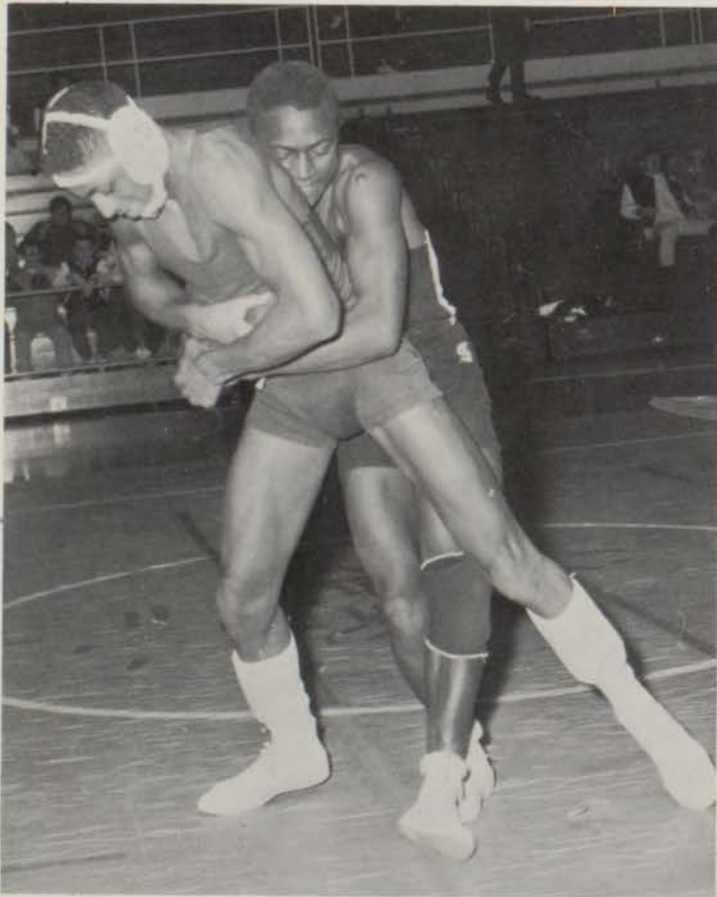
