
Some Enchanted Evening Musical Revue of Songs by Rodgers & Hammerstein Saturday, October 25, 2014



## **New Trees Have Arrived!**


Exciting accomplishments and upcoming improvements are happening on the James Millikin Homestead grounds.

The 1976 Schroll landscape plan serves as a guiding document for UI Extension Master Gardeners who anxiously relish another year of historic landscape gardening. The aging/diminishing tree plantation received a gift of five new trees. Mulching, weeding, watering and sympathetic pruning is being performed alongside Millikin University's grounds staff. New botanical labels are to be installed to incorporate a self-guided plant tour. A new treatment for the flagpole area is possible thanks, in great part, to the many volunteer hours and cooperation from all involved. The future holds another big project, a driveway replacement for the aging asphalt surface is on the drawing board.




