HISTORY

Lakeview enjoys enviable record during decade of progress.

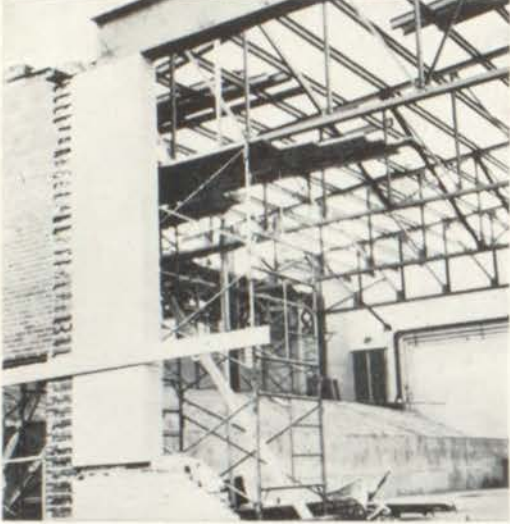
Lakeview began as a new community district in September, 1949, with a population of approximately three hundred students in grades 7 through 12. Mr. H. B. Green was superintendent and Mr. Frederick Godshalk was our first principal.

Lakeview soon established itself as an exceptional school with an experimental core program. The curriculum was centered around a common learnings program required of all students which studied personal-political-economic-socio problems felt to be important for better living in our democratic world. A revolutionary report card accompanied this program which was planned to serve as a guidance aid in student's total development.

In addition to a good basic academic program, Lakeview has in recent years built up exceptional courses in office occupations, diversified occupations and vocational art. Extra-curriculars have been an integral part of the day's schedule.

All Lakeview's innovations have been the result of much planning and evaluation on part of administrative, faculty and community lay groups through the years.

Other superintendents who have served Lakeview well have been: Mr. Lloyd Henson, Mr. K. V. Henninger, and Mr. John R. Reys. Principals have been Mr. Al Best, and Mr. David W. Beggs III, incumbent.



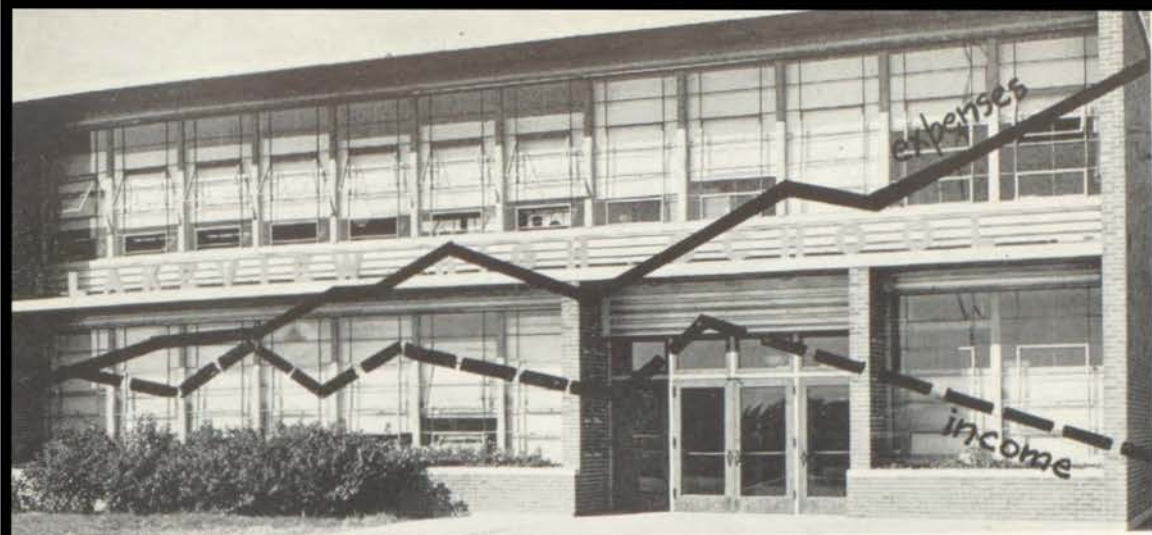
Scenes of early construction in fall of 1949—

Big news of year is annexation to Decatur school district.

Tripling of population and expenses was not matched by increased income. In addition, sections of the original area left the unit to join the city of Decatur, and thus the taxable property was reduced to the breaking point.

Despite the tremendous loyalty of citizens who carried one of highest tax rates in state, the situation reached a climax this year and annexation was dramatically petitioned and accepted. Lakeview is now a full partner in the Decatur charter district.

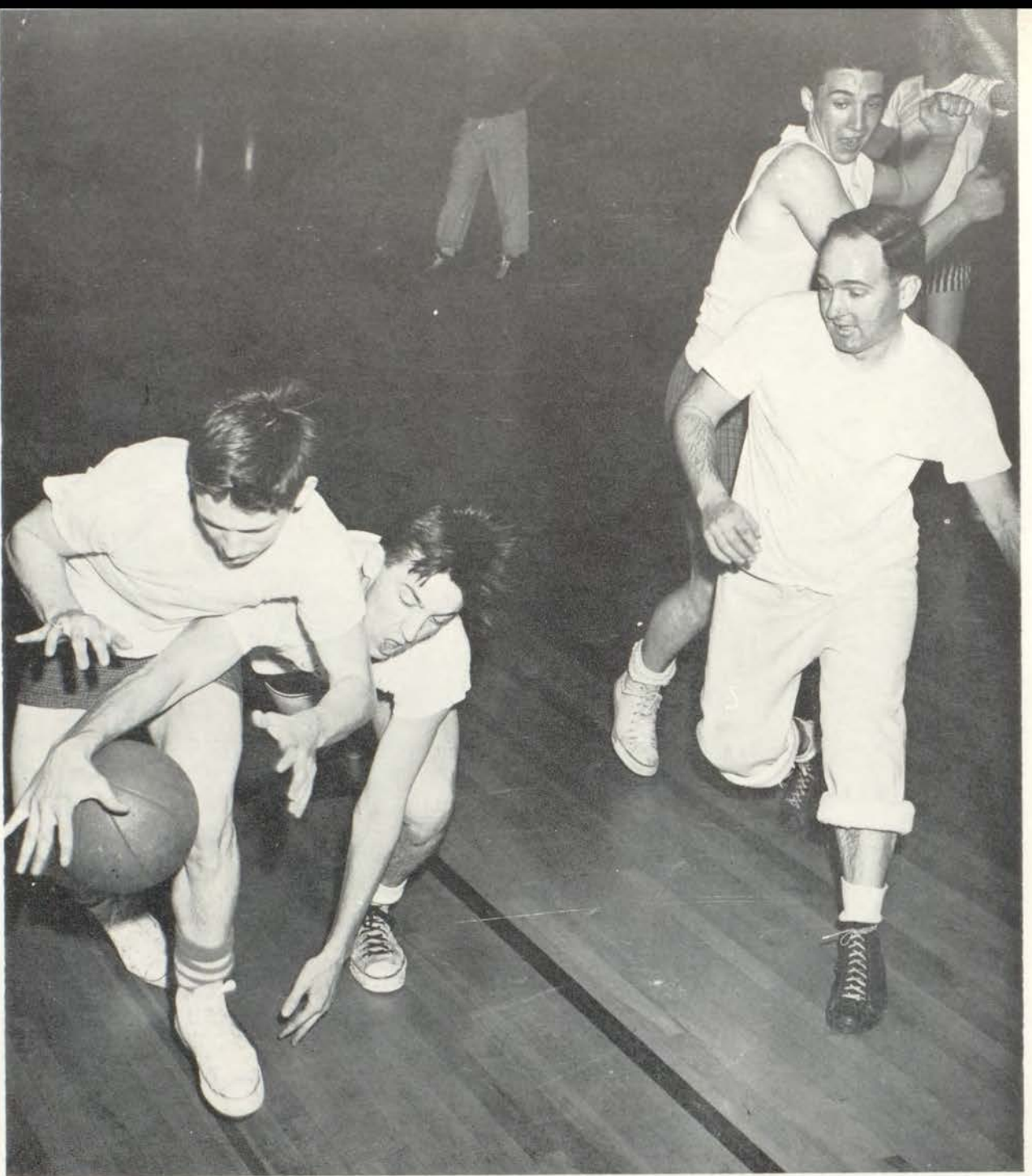

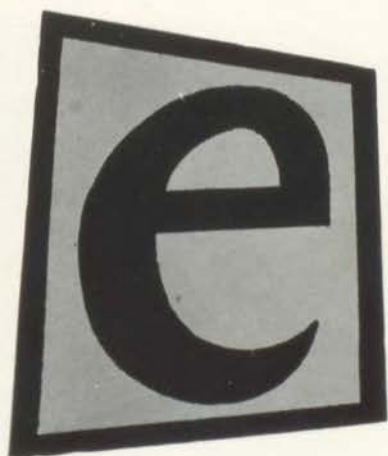

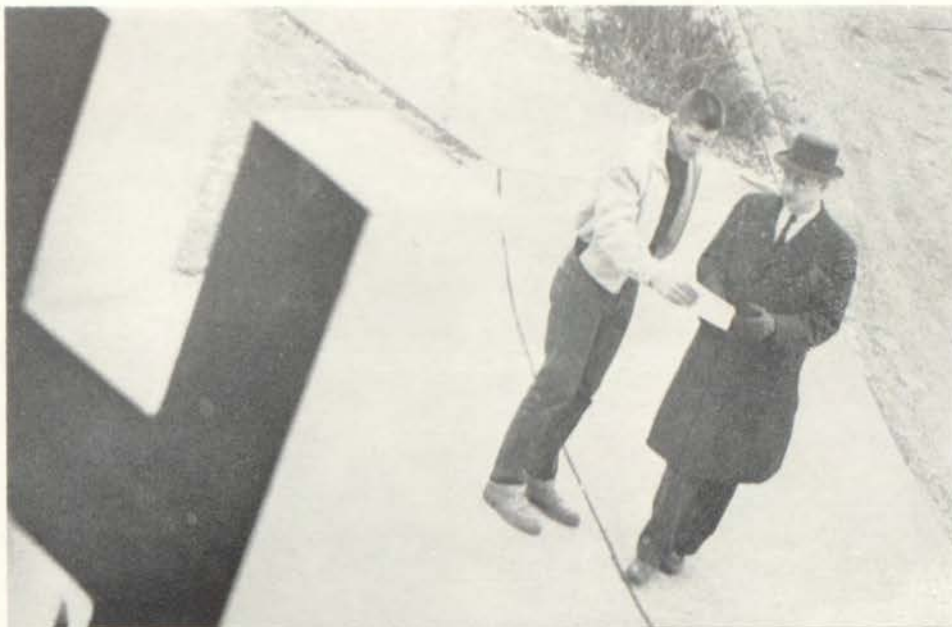

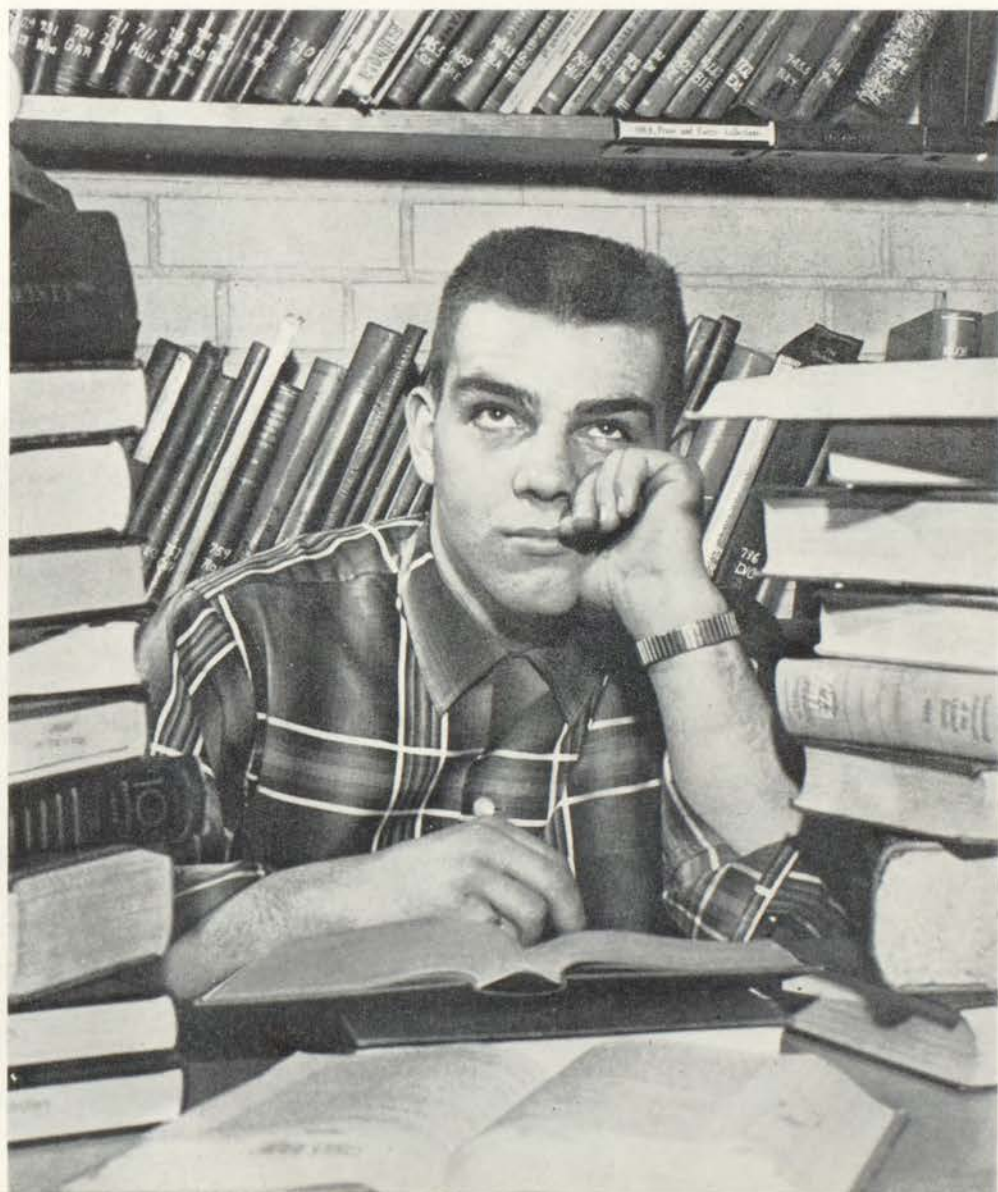

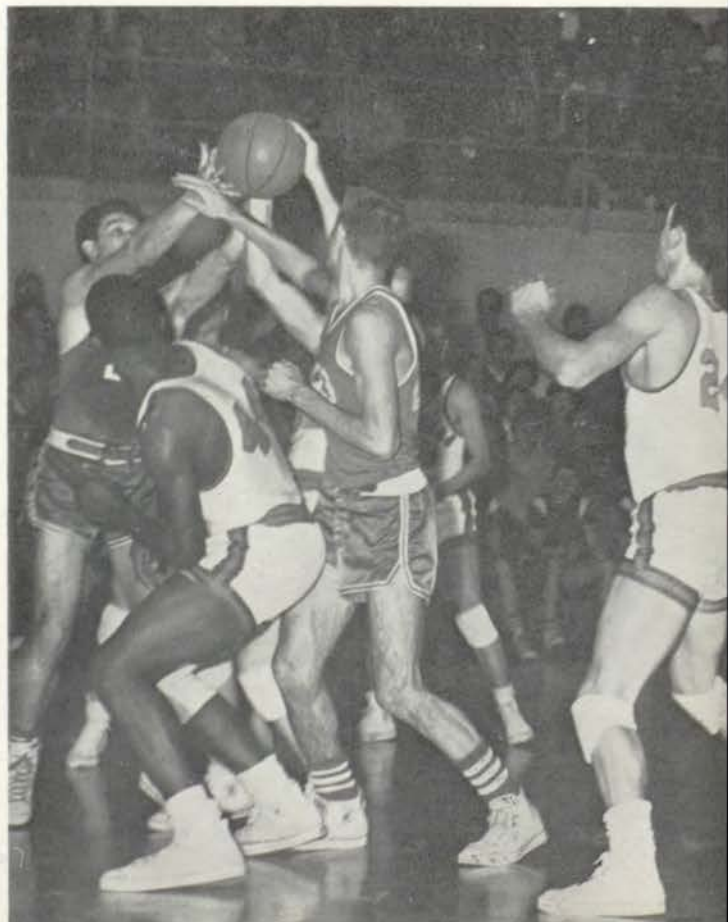

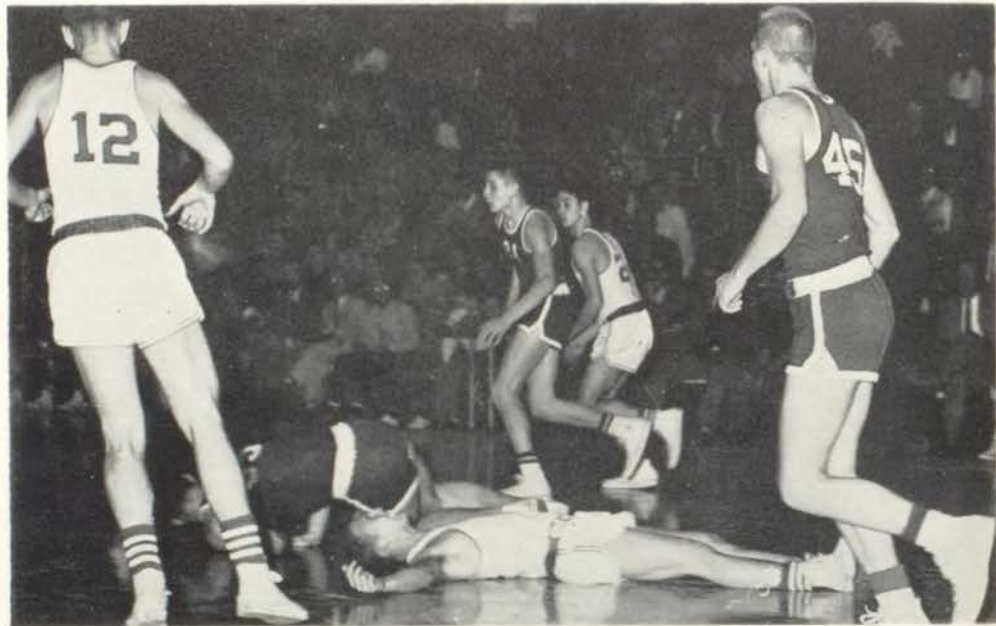
