

D.A.R. AWARD

Each year an outstanding senior girl is honored by receiving the award presented by the National Society of Daughters of the American Revolution. She is then eligible, along with representatives of other Illinois high schools, for the drawing in which a state representative is selected to take a trip with all expenses paid to a convention in Washington, D. C.

LINCOLN ESSAY AWARD

Mrs. Inez J.
