

The PURPOSE of the League of Women Voters is to promote political responsibility through informed and active participation of citizens in government.



LEAGUE PRINCIPLES

(Concepts of government, supported by the League as a whole, which constitute the authorization for adoption of national, state and local program.)

The League of Women Voters believes in representative government and in the individual liberties established in the Constitution of the United States.

The League of Women Voters believes that democratic government depends upon the informed and active participation of its citizens.

The League of Women Voters believes that every citizen should be protected in his right to vote; that every person should have access to free public education which provides equal opportunity for all; and that no person or group should suffer legal, economic, or administrative discrimination.

The League of Women Voters believes that efficient and economical government requires competent personnel, the clear assignment of responsibility, adequate financing, and coordination among the different agencies.

The League of Women Voters believes that responsible government should be responsive to the will of the people; that government should maintain an equitable and flexible system of taxation, promote the conservation and development of natural resources in the public interest, share in the solution of economic and social problems which affect the general welfare, promote a sound economy and adopt domestic policies which facilitate the solution of international problems.

The League of Women Voters believes that cooperation with other nations is essential in the search for solutions to world problems, and that the development of international organization and international law is imperative in the promotion of world peace.

Program in the League of Women Voters means government issues which members have chosen to consider and on which they may act after thorough study and discussion and after consensus of the membership is reached.

Program selection at all three levels (local, state and national) begins with suggestions by individual members. From these suggestions the appropriate board prepares a proposed program on which members vote - personally on local program at the annual meeting of their league, and through delegates on state and national program at conventions. Any item suggested previously (but not on the proposed program) may be considered and adopted.

NATIONAL PROGRAM FOR 1972-74 (Adopted at National Convention, May 1972)

Environmental Quality - Support of a physical environment beneficial to life: action to promote wise use of water resources and improvement of water and air quality. Evaluation of solid waste management, including reuse, reclamation and recycling.

Land Use

Evaluation of land-use policies and procedures and their relationship to human needs, population trends, and ecological and socioeconomic factors.

Human Resources - Support of equal rights for all regardless of race or sex, with recognition of the special needs of American Indians: action to combat poverty and discrimination and to provide equal access to employment, housing and quality education.

International Relations - Support of policies to promote international cooperation and world peace:

action to promote international trade and development efforts, to further normalization of relations with the People's Republic of China and to strengthen the peacekeeping and peacebuilding functions of the United Nations system. Evaluation of current trade patterns and their impact on the U. S. and world economy. (See consensus in June/July National Voter).

Representative Government - Support of an open governmental system that is representative and responsive. U.S. Congress - study of and action for responsive legislative processes: study of campaign financing (decision of National Council meeting, May 1973).

Election of the President - action for election of the president and vice president of the U.S. by direct national popular vote. District of Columbia - action for self-government and representation in Congress for citizens of the District of Columbia. Apportionment - action for apportionment substantially on population of congressional districts and of all elected state and local governmental bodies. Voting Rights - (Bylaws, Article XIII, Section 1, a) Action to protect the rights of every citizen.
