BOARD MEETING, THURSDAY, October 5, 1950

The Board of Directors of the Macon County League of Women Voters met on October 5th, 1950, at two o'clock, in the Association of Commerce Conference Room, 14 members present.

The meeting was called to order by Mrs. Floyd Birt, President, and the minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. The Treasurer's Report showed a balance of \$437.83, as of September 30th, 1950.

Mrs. E. L. Simmons, Chairman of the Finance Drive, reported a total of \$536.25. Mrs. Simmons complimented the members on their work on the drive, and the members of the Board expressed their appreciation of the result of the drive. It was suggested by Mrs. Cox that Mrs. Simmons give her report on the Finance Drive to the complete membership of the League, and Mrs. Doubleday was, also, requested by the President to send out a bulletin to the membership on the result of the drive.

Mrs. Birt stated that Mrs. Lofton Devore will take over the Voters' Service work.

It was suggested by Mrs. Smith, Program Chairman, that the membership of the League not have a regular general meeting the last of October and that all members axxxx do what they can on the Voters' Service. Discussion followed concerning placing the Voters' Service booths in the laundry mats in the city prior to the election. It was felt that the booths should be occupied on two days, and Monday and Tuesday were felt to be the most likely days. It was suggested by Mrs. Kuhns that we have a "School for Workers" who are going to work in the Voters' Service Booths. The 26th was decided upon for the School on Gateway for the workers. It was also suggested that a member of the Board be outside the polling places on election day to remind voters to vote on the Blue Ballot.

Mrs. Smith said the next discussion group will meet on October 12th at the home of Mrs. Carl Sanders, 1660 West Reverview. Mrs. Madeline Babcock Smith will review the book "All manner of Men", by Malcolm Ross, in connection with the League's study of F.E.P.C. There will also be someone at this meeting to talk on the Interceptor Sewer.

Mrs. Catt reported on the following mew members: Mrs. Morris Sly, Mrs. Otis Chumbley, Mrs. J. I. Gates, Mrs. Edith C. Ridgley and Mrs. Frank Schroeder.

Mrs. Hipsher, Membership Chairman, reported on the Blue Ballot Tea held at the home of Mrs. Beatty. She described it as quite a social success, and that the guests seemed to be quite interested in the League.

Mrs. Catt brought the United Nations Flag, which will be put together before the meeting on the 26th.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 3:35 P.M.
